Photo 820528-4 Vail-like clouds in Stewart Cirque with Stewart Falls in lower right.

Photo 820528-5 Clouds on Elk Peak. Clearview moraine on lower right. Note lack of trees on S exposure of this moraine. Could this be a factor of time since the glacier left the canyon.

Photo 820528-6 of Stewart Cirque from most westerly ski run just W of chair lift run. Jack Wapkinson chalet in foreground. Mary + Anno Little chalet roof to left, chimney near center of roof. Some wisps of clouds still in Cirque area. <sup>Eagle cliffs extreme left + center edge.</sup>

Photo 820528-7 Robert Redford's property. Old house in lower left, new home above. Snow of last night still on roof of house on fields protected by ridge shadow. Snow still on shrubs above the home site.

Photo 820528-9 Stewart Cirque from ski slopes (E side) with some clouds still in area. Part of eagle nesting cliffs can be seen.

Photo 820528-10 Ski slopes. Cleared area. Stewart Cirque in background. It is getting more and more difficult to photograph mt. without getting chair lift lines running across view.

Photo 820528-11 Mt. Timpanogos from same general area as above.

Photo 820528-12. Stewart Cirque from Sundance ski area (E side) with 2 open trees in foreground.

Photo 820528-13 Divide between Scotts Canyon to S and Sundance to N. This divide just west of ridges & peaks E of ski area and W of north fork of Provo Canyon.

Continued E up draw to Sunken Lake on divide. 10:30

This sunken lake bed is from 6' to 8' below outlet and presumably water drains into cavernous rocks of divide.

This depression may lead to underground cavern. From E side of depression photo 820528-14 of Stewart's Cirque with maple trees in foreground on right side. Vegetation in Overwhelm Tract still brownish red for winter condition.

There is a small secondary peak at E end of Sunken Lake that lies between Broken Rock Peak to the N and Middle Peak to the S. This peak is named Sunken Lake Prominence.

On top of this knoll, porcupines have eaten the bark from the small scrub oak trees at about standing height. Continued S up across snow bank from old cornice, thence to top of Middle Peak which runs S as a level ridge, so named.
