

Left observation post 10:00 A.M. Left Little Chalet at 6:15 P.M. and checked golden eagle nest in cliffs S of entrance of N. Fork Creek into Provo River at Wildwood. 2 young are white and approx. $1/3$ size of adult. Arrived Mary's in Provo at 6:50 P.M. Remained at Mary's tonight and prepared to leave for Kansas.

Provo, Utah

May 30, 1982

Continued preparation to leave Provo for Kansas. This evening drove up to Wasatch State Park with trailer and camped there tonight.

Wasatch State Park, Heber Valley, Utah.

May 31, 1982

Frost on ground. Before leaving Wasatch State Park photos 820531-1 to 5 of Wallberg Ridge and Cascade Range drainage and the area of Windy Pass and Provo Peak. Photo 820531-2 of ^{oaks and} mt. Timpanogas from slope above Deer Creek State Park just E of dam, of Deer Creek Reservoir. Photo 820531-3 of Cascade Range N side of Deer Creek dam. 8 western grebes in reservoir approx 200' E of dam. 3 magpies so far. at Wildwood at mouth of N. Fork Provo River photo 820531-4 of eagle cliffs on mt S of Wildwood. Photo 820531-5 close-up of above showing white golden eagle (white dot) on nest. This nest is $1\frac{2}{3}$ height of larger (right-hand side one) from top of this conifer and $1/3$ east large conifer nest of general N exposure of canyon but nest faces N.E. The 2 young are very conspicuous on nest when viewed thru binoculars. (20x) Continued down

Provo Canyon to Canyon Glenn Park, parked car and left R.R. bridge that crosses Provo River at 9:05 A.M. Strong and cold down canyon wind. Oaks ^(leaves) now 6" long as compared to 1" to 4" long of these same oak (scrub) trees of May 16, 1982. 9:21 water flume (now a covered solid duct in comparison with the open flume of years ago). California gulls flying up canyon against wind. Continued up trail to petroglyphs and at marker (U.S. Dept. Interior, Bureau Land Management) recordered inscription
