

and thence N up north fork of Provo Canyon to Stewart Flat and aspen area but traverse across N slope of Provo Canyon up ridges to Squaw Knife Pass. Provo Canyon & north fork probably had more water and flooding than at present and travel by that route would have required many dangerous fordings. This condition would also apply for American Fork Canyon route to the E side of Timpanogas. The alternate route is up face of Timpanogas to major benchland, thence N to a continuation of this major benchland (actually it is an erosional plain that continues E to the divide N of Aspen Grove), and thence E along a practically flat graded trail to Timpanogas basin area and even to the E & S to divide N of Aspen Grove. This old trail is the easiest access to the summer hunting ground of the E slope of Mt. Timpanogas. Convenient travel on the N slope of Provo Canyon can be made from ^{Utah} valley all the way to Upper Falls Resort at which point cliffs require contact of trail with Provo River.

at petroglyph site at no. 6 rock observed a brown snake approx. 2 feet long and $\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide. 3 major deer trails cross the site from E to W, some from S to N up slope.

Took the following photos (Kodachrome, 35) of as many individual sites as possible, generally a detailed part of the rock and a general view showing relationship with other petroglyphs in the site. all from Stranded Valley Petroglyph Site.
