

Indian habitation. This anticline may have been the subject of petroglyph forms. I have never found petroglyphs among scrub oak trees and wonder if the trees were in same position as when petroglyphs were first made on the ridge. There are useable rocks among trees.

Photo 820531-12 of a boulder located among petroglyph rocks that has fractured in two directions. Note movement and space between fragments. Edges of fracture shows very little erosion and this rock may have fractured at the same time as increased effacement of petroglyphs in recent years. Photo to W. This rock is approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ way between rock no 670815-1 and 670815-11.

Photo 820531-13 view to WSW from petroglyph site showing Gateman's Rocks at mouth of Provo Canyon.

Photo 820531-14 of rock no 670815-9 viewing S. Photo 670818-13 taken 15 years ago is same as above in exposure of rock and subject.

Photo 820531-15 shows rock no 670815-1 and viewing to SE.

Photo 670818-9 is the same subject and direction as above. Anticline in right side of photo.

Photo 820531-16 is E side of rock no 670815-1 showing fairly good preservation of petroglyphs. Not as much desert burnish as other rocks. Photo 670818-12 is the same size and subject as above (820531-16)

Photo 820531-17 of rock no 670818-1 viewing to S? Snake in an old scale surface. The S side of this boulder is badly etched. Photo 670818-11 is identical in size & subject and taken 15 years ago.

Photo 820531-18 is center of rock no 670818-1 on S exposure. Part badly etched and eroded.

Photo 820531-19 of rock no 670818-1 of W exposure. Preservation is good.

Photo 820531-20 of rock no. 670818-25 (SW exposure). This rock is 3' W of no 670818-6

Photo 820531-21 of rock number 670818-6. Photo 670818-28 taken 15 years ago is identical in subject and size as above photo (no 820531-21) Subject on SW corner of rock.

Photo 820531-22 of rocks nos. 670818-6 and 670818-25 viewing E. The old Indian trail passes by these rocks on S or right hand side of rocks. This petroglyph may have reference
