They guess would be that it is part of the territory of the Pleasant Grove eagle.

Photo 820601-5 showing Stranded Valley Petroglyph Site with lower ^(off road tracks) W ridge, middle ridge & E ridge.

Left Pole Canyon and at Vivian Park climbed knoll to N of bridge and took several photographs. This is one of the places I favored as a vantage point for viewing up or down Provo Canyon and Vivian Park & S Fork to S. When a child living at Vivian Park during the summers. This is a unique area and should be saved from development. Already Robert Redford has designs to run a tram from Vivian Park to Stewards Flat via Squaw Knife Ridge and Pass. This area (top of knoll) would be a valuable piece of property and one I would like to own.

Photo 820601-6 of Annette near top of knoll & S Fork beyond. She is travelling a trail to my past. Cliff beyond is ^{first salitaire} place I saw Photo 820601-7 from top to W down Provo Canyon. The top of this knoll may have been one of the remnants of Provo Canyon floors.

Photo 820601-8. Ibid. Rock slide low left has eroded re-vegetation since it formed years ago (see notes of this slide described from year to year from its inception).

Photo 820601-9 from near top to S showing mt above Vivian Park Lake and S Fork beyond.

Left Vivian Park and at Deer Creek Reservoir took photo 820601-9 of island in lake. Trees (Cottonwoods) have grown in since water was put into impoundment. Timpanogas in background.
