June 7, 1982

June 27, 1982

Same area as above. A common grackle, brown, glossless with blackish head fed in backyard. When light reflected in a specific angle there was a suggestion of purple in black head. This unusually color grackle, picked up 4 moths from grass on lawn. It carried them as if for young but when it found an angleworm it ate the moths, then the angleworm and then picked up 4 more moths & held them in its beak while foraging.
