 8:47 tide 16 1/2"
 8:49 tide 17" long
 8:51 beginning of log & debris flotsam restricted to
 a zone approx. 1/2 way across bay to 1/10 mi. out from
 camp. Cormorants (double-crested riding on logs). Some
 logs 40' long and 3' diameter.
 Other debris all sizes logs and
 considerable kelp etc.
