Two mew gulls worked water near shore. They are more active in movement and in searching for food on top of the water.

A glaucous-winged gull alighted in the water, then left and gained 3 feet altitude and then dove straight down into water carrying $\frac{3}{4}$ of body to emerge with a 5" flat sculpinlike fish. It carried it to the beach and consumed part of it.

This afternoon ^(2:00 p.m.) made trip to Padilla Bay National Estuarine Sanctuary on E shore Padilla Bay. Checked Interpretative Center in displays marbled godwit = common snipe, western sandpiper = sanderling. No view of bay along entire route except at Bay View State Park where we were able to park off the main road.

The map below indicates distribution of ducks and other aquatic birds in the Padilla Bay. yellow area concentration of ducks. The raft W of the national Estuarine Sanctuary is the most concentrated distribution of birds in the bay.
