

sailed straight to Leo Reef alighting first on top of marine signal light and loosing footing slipped to platform below. The 18 harbor seals and 3 glaucous-winged gulls did not react to the eagles arrival. The eagle remained for 12 minutes

March 6, 1986

at 7:20 A.M. imm. bald eagle flew N and at 7:35 what appeared to be same individual, flew S.

3 pigeon guillemot in summer plumage in area at 9:00 A.M.
at 1:00 P.M. first purple finch at feeder, 4 males 3 females.
also one dark-eyed junco (Oregon race).

March 7, 1986

wind last night from SE which continued most of morning. Waves high on cliffs.

7:15 gulls active

7:30 first bald eagle (imm) circled to N.

during the high wind mew gulls work waves for $1/10$ mi and then would fly N with wind to circle back and start all over. Some mew gulls ride swells and crests with wings spread so that the transition over crests of waves was uninterrupted. There was also a group of gulls, mainly glaucous-winged gulls that controlled the area from 50' to 200' above water.

At 9:15 2 otter passed observation post along edge of rocks.

9:30 A.M. waves lower and occasional sun.

This P.M. went to Lopez Village which measured 4.4 miles along road to Odlin Park, thence Center Road S to first rd W, thence S to Lopez Village.

In evening at the house a great blue heron flew toward rocks below the house but at S side Cove ^{it} saw me and turned around & flew to Far Point to S.

March 8, 1986

From 3 floor of house first bald eagle (imm.) flew to S past house.

6:05 A.M. imm. bald eagle flew N past house.

6:08 first glaucous gull flew S and then average one every 3 minutes (to S).

6:10 imm. eagle flew to S.

6:12 " " " to N.

6:20 bald eagle (ad.) to S
