march 20, 1986

Observed first bat, Myotis size, fly by window between house and Douglas fir trees. It passed 5 times then left. Time dusk.

march 21, 1986

Counted 84 glaucous-winged gull perched on top/upper half of 7 lower island and generally distributed, there were 76 gulls of the above species on lower half and congregated in one group.

Bald eagle flew by Bee House this AM.


The reddish foliage or inflorescences on Blakely Island (south airport runway) is gradually changing to a greenish yellow.

March 22, 1986

Sun up 7:35 AM, over Blakely  → S.

At 8:00 AM first robin (2) in tree by house. Also the pine siskin appeared at feeder. Also first golden-crowned Kinglet in area. Also first song sparrow at feeder.

Red-shafted flicker called today. It has called 3 days previously. Bald eagle on Douglas fir limb 2 feet from feeder area. Two otter swim by. Also 2 harbor seal near shore but with just head above water.

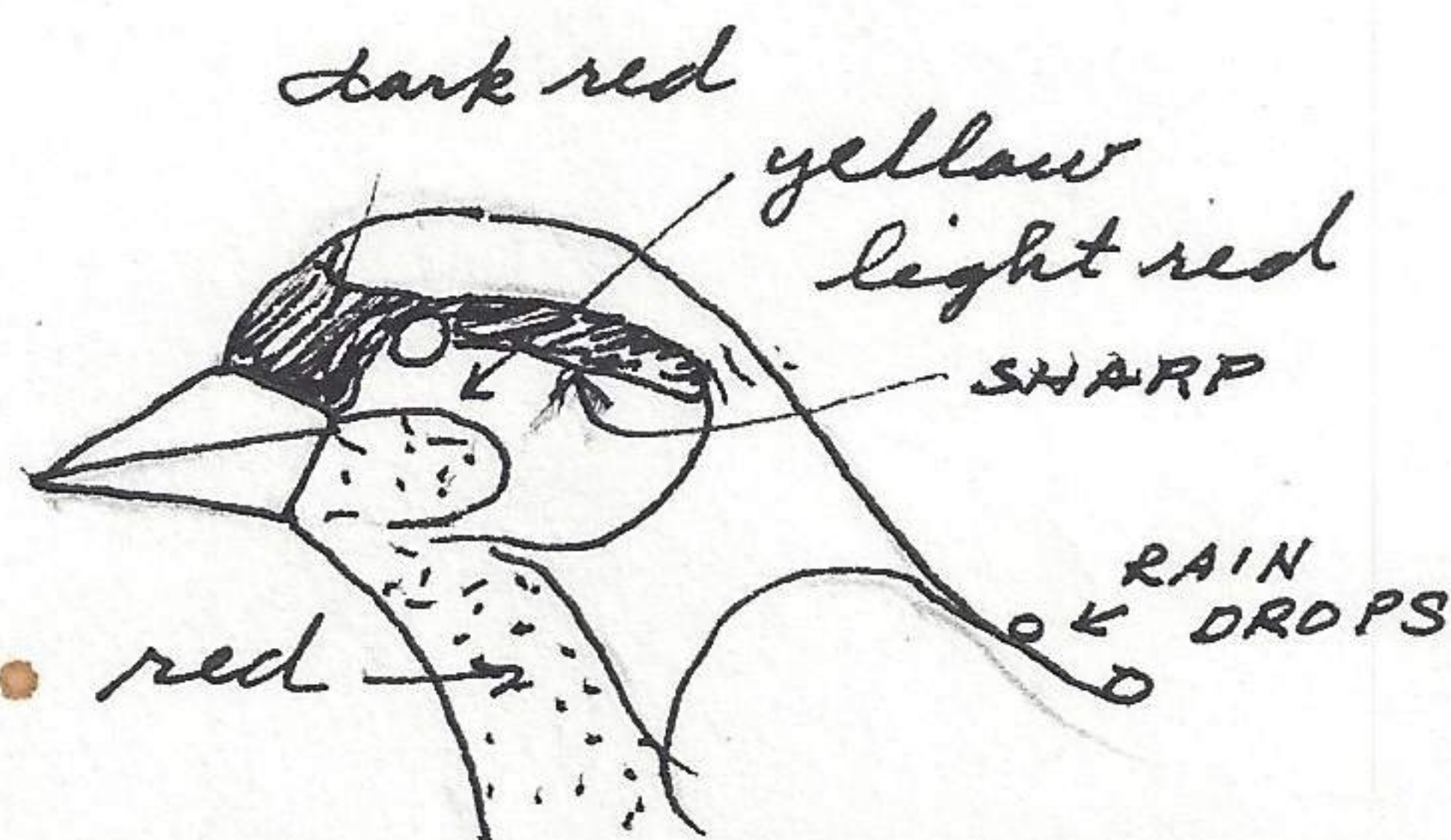

march 23, 1986
