Glaucous-winged gulls called from Flower Island until late dusk.

The Eastern gray squirrel is the most aggressive feed at the porch station. Finches (purple) are the most aggressive of the birds.

12:45 P.M. immature bald eagle on no 3 rock of Leo Reef Complex adult bald eagle on rock no 4 of Leo Reef Complex.

Harbor seal: #4 = 7 seals, #5 = 9 seals, #6 = 7 seals or total of 23 harbor seals. Glaucous-winged gulls call for 1/2 hour after the bald eagle invades their reef & wing area.

Glaucous-winged gulls called until after dusk on Flower Island.
