

Harbor seals on Leo Reef assume the following characteristic poses.



6:35 A.M. 3 river otter swim π along shoreline 8 feet from shore.

6:35 A.M. The following birds appeared in this order of time: pine siskin, purple finch, dark-eyed juncos, Townsend chipmunk.

7:45 Eastern gray squirrel at porch feeder (NE end Bee House) and is identified by right ear with split on edge.

Silver or candlefish active π to 8 feet from shoreline.

no bald eagles or mew gull on scene as yet (7:45 A.M.)

9:30 A.M. 'marlin' from Shelton displaced harbor seals on Leo Reef by approaching too close.

One particular f purple finch displaced all other finches as well as pine siskins. I have not observed this behaviorism to date.

12:45 P.M. 15 harbor seal on Leo Reef (rock no. 4 = 7 seal; rock no. 5 = 7 seal and rock no 6 = 4 seal.

Bald eagle flew by low over Leo Reef but did not displace harbor seal.

Both f and f purple finch are fisty. Observed 23 encounters between f purple finch but not directed toward f purple finch, house finches or pinesiskin. Average number of purple finch on porch feeder is 13.

The house finch can be told from purple finch by:

Lack head stripes f ; lighter head; smaller; smaller bill and red a light red rather than purple red and red more restricted in distribution

4:30 P.M. 18 harbor seal on Leo Reef

6:30 P.M. 3 river otter caught candlefish 12' off shoreline below Bee House.

6:30 P.M. Harbor seal on the following rocks of Leo Reef.
