April 3, 1986

6:15 A.M. to 6:25 A.M. large fish active in what would be the ferry route E of Bee House. First evidence 2 surface disturbances and increased to approx 150, then to 150 and finally subsided. These are individual fish surfacings. These fish attracted 3 mew gulls.

8:06 A.M. Leo Reef. Rock # 4, 1 harbor seal; Rock # 5, 1 seal.

10:18 A.M. Immature bald eagle flew by Bee House above shoreline (40' above) and left shoreline at Lichen Point.

Crow in last two days called like an old dog, with weak vocalization

11:15 A.M. British war ship passed. ^{to 5,} (no. 264), harbor

11:20 A.M. 18 harbor seal on Leo Reef, Rock no. 4. 3, seal in water by rocks. The seals covered 90% of surface at this stage of tide.

12:30 P.M. 18 harbor seal on Leo Reef, Rock no 4, and 1 on Rock no 3.

12:31 P.M. Townsend chipmunk left Bee House deer feeder and travelled up Gratto Ridge to Lower Parking area, thence across into Joyce Fralic property. I have observed them to follow
