

10:15 A.M. 45 birds on harrow disc feeder including; 4 house finch; 16 ♂ purple finch; 6 pine siskin, 19 ♀ purple finch. When birds leave the feeder, one or more pine siskin will remain and can be approached to 3-4 feet. This fearlessness is also common in nature beyond feeding area.

10:18 a male pine siskin fed 15 particles of food to a female, which fluttered its wings the entire time.

10:20 A band-tailed pigeon flew by but did not stop at feeder.

Deciduous trees on S NW side Blakely Island are 50-50 per cent green & yellow. Lower trees on slope more yellowish than those higher on the slope.

6:40 P.M. rufous hummingbird on sugar feeder but did not partake.

8:30 A.M. 5 harbor seal on Leo Reef.

Eastern gray squirrel prefers cracked corn to bird seed. whereas birds prefer the bird seeds

April 19, 1986

8:00 A.M. 86 glaucous-winged gulls on crest and side of Flower Island. 44 on N rocks of lowland. No signs of pairs of gulls.  crest & sides

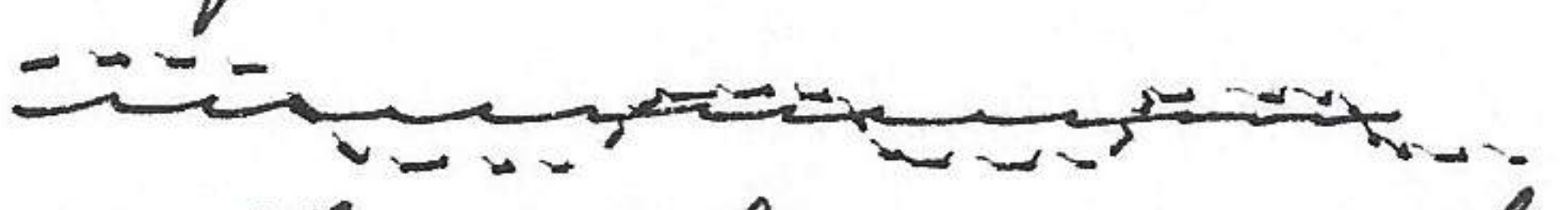
rock outcrop on N lowland of Island

April 20, 1986

Both birds and mammals wipe bill or mouth on limbs after they feed.

11 harbor seals on N Flower Rock, no seals on Leo Reef. (when making census of seal, Leo Reef, N Flower Rock, Big Flower Rock & Little Flower Rock are checked)

Rufous humming bird checked sugar feeder twice but did not feed.

6:45 A.M. River otter passed ^{in front of} Bee House. It was 4 seconds on surface and 4 seconds below water surface as it passed by.  covering equal distance whether on the surface or under the water surface.

April 21, 1986

7:00 A.M. 72 glaucous-winged gulls on top of island, 41 on rock outcrop on N lowland of island.
