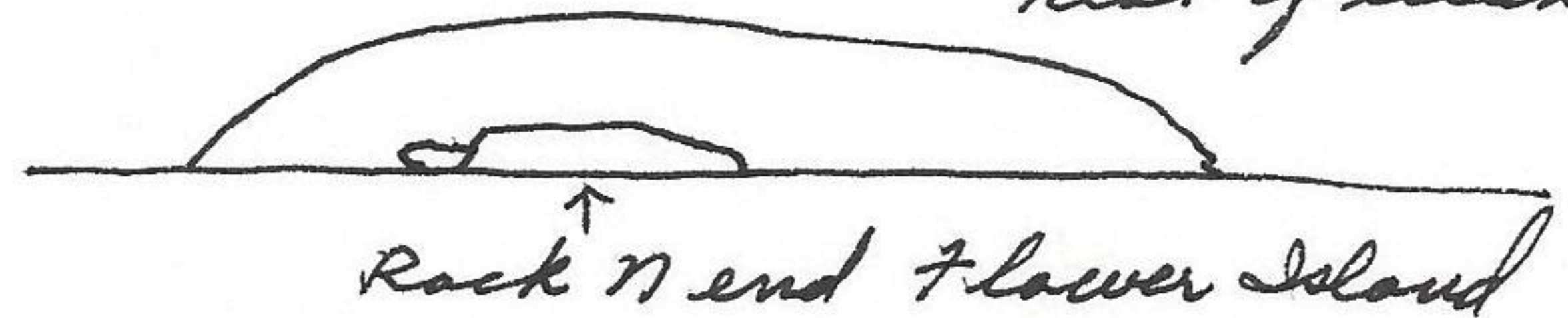


- 12:20 P.M. 52 glaucous-winged gulls on upper slopes of Flower Island and 30 on rock prominence on n end of island
- 12:25 P.M. 28 harbor seal on n Flower Rock and 4 on Leo Reef.
- 2:30 P.M. 86 Bonaparte gulls feeding SW Leo Reef and 82 resting on Leo Reef.

Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Wash.
April 24, 1986

- 8:05 A.M. 36 glaucous-winged gulls Top Flower Island, 34 rocks n end Island. Top or upper slopes = rest of island.



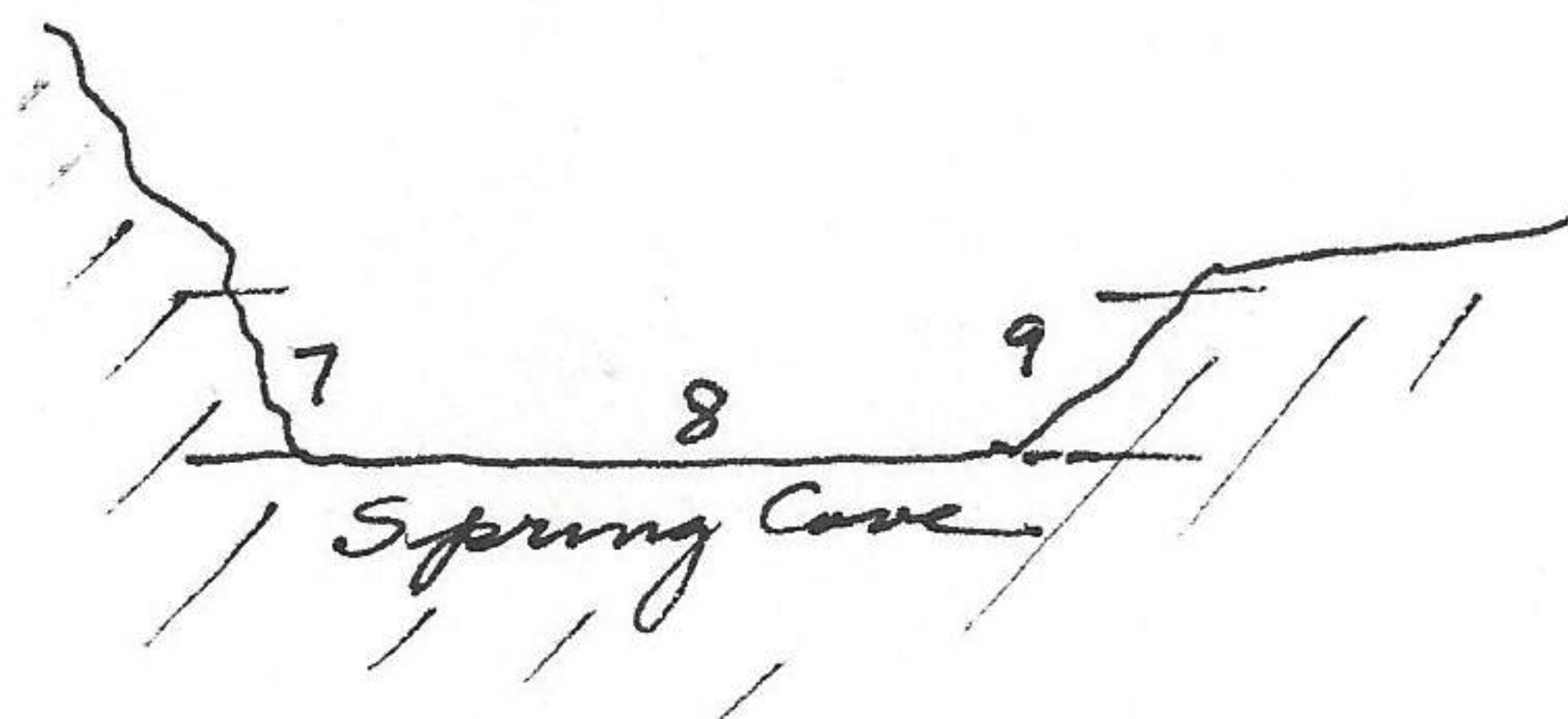
- 9:10 A.M. 2 seal Leo Reef, 5 glaucous-winged gulls.
- 10:10 A.M. Turkey vulture flew over Bee House to n. male house finch fed begging ♀ house finch (could be young?). They flew away together.
- 10:30 A.M. Band-tailed pigeon at feeder. They come every 2 or 3 days.
- 2:10 P.M. waves 24 per minute. 55 glaucous-winged gulls on top Flower Island, 59 on rock n end Island. With high wind and cool weather only few rested on top Flower Island.
- 5:40 P.M. waves 24 per minute. Wind at 120°.

April 25, 1986

Wind all night. Day with some sun but cloudy. Waves changed this A.M. from 120° to 150°.

10:35 2 eastern gray squirrels feed 8" apart. These squirrels always displace the Townsend Chipmunk.

12:01 P.M. Low tide at this time -2.9' checked number of starfish (Ochre Sea Star, *Pisaster ochraceus*) on rocky slopes and across Cove of Spring Cove when tide was -2.9'.



There were 7 on n side, 9 on S side and 8 across the cove. Most of the starfish were above low tide. Orange purple dominated. Other color phases present.

6:30 P.M. high tide 11.8 ft.
