8:51 P.M. glaucous-winged gull on porch feeder.

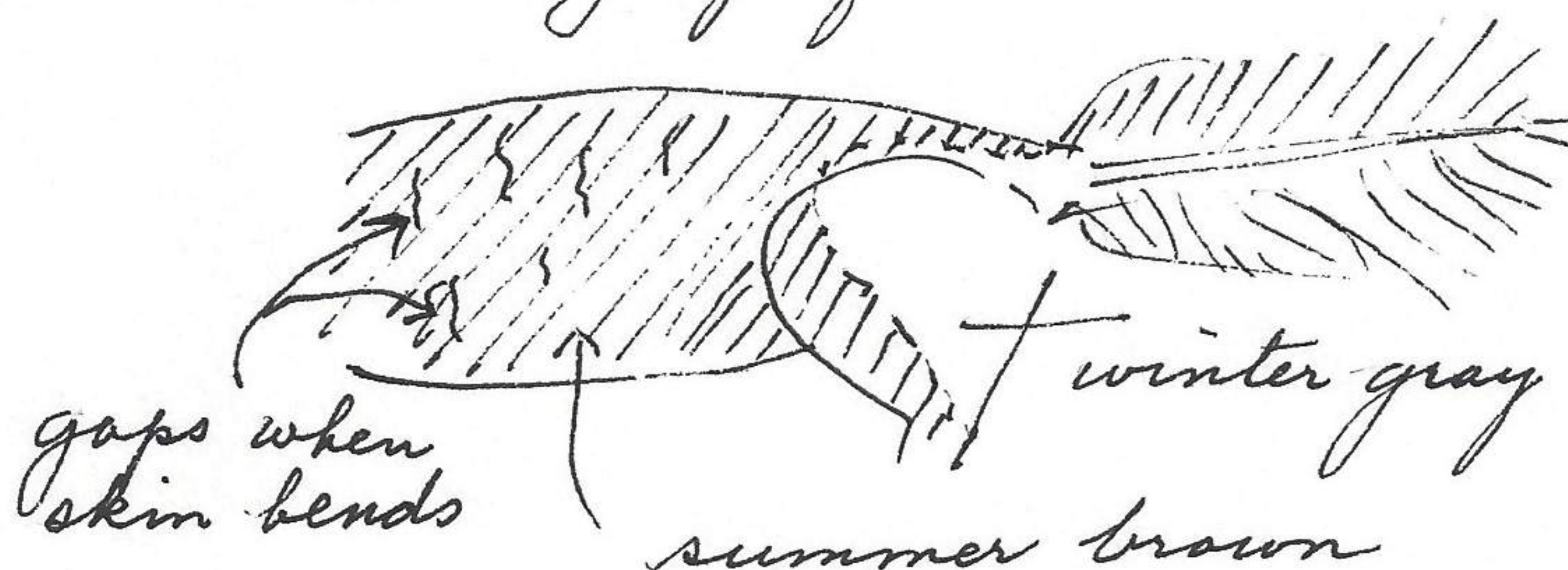
9:00 P.M. myotis? active around Bee House.
