7:30 P.M. A ^{harbor} seal caught 5 candlefish in 5 tries. 40' out from Bee House.

8:45 P.M. Pine siskin on porch feeder

Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Island, Wa.
 May 19, 1986

This A.M. water calm and no difference between color of Islands and their perfect reflection. Spent afternoon at East Sound, Orcas Island.

May 20, 1986

Early this morning perfect reflections of islands. no detail of islands visible at this time, just a dark mass.

Between 9:45 and 10:30 A.M. a log moved from Boundary Point, straight across to Lechen Point and then n along shoreling past Spring Cove and finally ended in front of Bee House, on its way to Boundary Point.

10:30 72 glaucous-winged gulls on top Flower Island, 38 on rocks n end of island.

10:15 an adult bald eagle flew past Bee House to first Douglas fir tree on Lechen Point. Remained 35 minutes then flew south into Swift Bay area. While in tree a glaucous-winged gull harassed the eagle 15 times.

4 cormorants of Leo^{#11} rock.

12:35 P.M. 12 band-tailed pigeons at ^{porch} feeder. These birds are the most wary of any other bird or mammal in area. a simple lifted finger will alert them and generally send them away from the area.

A young purple finch begs for food but will also eat independently.

Trip to Lopez Village.

Swift Lagoon. 2 Canadian geese, ad. bald eagle flew from W to E approx 1/10 mi n of Lagoon.

1916 School House, 8 single Brewers blackbirds in fields
 In field to S 13 crows in one group.

4:30 P.M. no harbor seal on Leo Reef.
