

- 4:00 P.M. rufous hummingbird at Lower Parking area.
- 6:05 P.M. adult bald eagle on Flower Island to 6:38 P.M. The eagle caused considerable activity on the island. The glaucous-winged gulls were: 90 in water about 2/10 miles W island, 50 remained on island, 33 in air and diving at eagle or a total of 163 gulls. 4 crows (American) also dive-bombed the eagle. Eagle left, circled the island and alighted again and then left at 6:38.
- 6:41<sup>PM</sup> gulls immediately returned to island (148 on the island.)
- 6:45 P.M. 3 harbor seal on Leo Reef.
- 9:00 P.M. wind blowing into Spring Cove and depositing debris and logs up to 15' x 8" dia. covering approx. 40% of cove. As tide moved out the wind kept debris in cove and it was gradually deposited on shore as water dropped. Incoming tide raised debris and it finally moved out of cove and to the S. another large mass of debris was located just this side of traffic lane.

May 31, 1986

Sun up 5:35 A.M.

- 5:40 A.M. 2 Canadian geese flew S.
- 10:05 A.M. Pontoon plane full length Lopez Sound at 4' above water.
- no rufous hummingbirds today. no mule deer last 2 days.
- O'Leary at their house today. 3 children & 2 dogs played continuously all day on 2 rafts, shoreline, throwing rocks & debris into the water, dog retrieved sticks and target practice in evening. There must be better ways of enjoying the shoreline, instead of using it as a recreational play yard.
- 6:08 P.M. 76 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island, 35 on prominent rocks on N end of island, 2 pairs gulls copulating.

June 1, 1986

- 7:00 A.M. On Flower Island: 150<sup>glaucous winged gulls</sup> on top island, 45 on rocks on N end island, 14 in air above island. Of those on top 13 were <sup>in</sup> pairs.
- 17 boats anchored at Spencer Spits
- 7:15 A.M. An American Crow fed 1 foot from eastern gray squirrel on porch feeder.
- 10:30 A.M. an adult ♀, young ♀, young ♂ at kitchen feeder.
- 2:10 P.M. adult ♀ at feeder. Orange-crowned warbler in tree above.
