

8:48 P.M. 11 harbor seal on Leo Reef, 9 glaucous-winged gulls and 4 double-crested cormorants.

8:49 P.M. all gulls left Flower Island and flew out over water to the N. Could not see an eagle in area but suspect that there may be one.

Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Washington.
June 3, 1986

7:32 A.M. 22 harbor seal on north Flower Rock and 3 on Little Flower Rock. At one instance they all left but returned and took position on rocks in 10 minutes on Little Flower Rock. There was considerable defense of resting spots.

10:22 to 10:26 5 ^{mule} deer fed at corn feeder, not, however, all at once. adult ♀ drove away other adult ♀ by hitting the second ♀ in rump with front feet. Deer at feeder:

adult ♀, probably mother of rest of deer in group.

adult ♀, slightly smaller and may be 3 generations back.

young ♀, medium size

young ♂, small (last year young) 3/4 high antler buds covered ^{with hair}.

young ?, slightly smaller than above, young ♂ and probably sister of ♂ above.

Both Townsend chipmunk and gray squirrel at deer feeder and waiting their turn.

1:35 P.M. Leo Reef 25 harbor seal, 76 cormorants, 21 glaucous-winged gulls. Little Flower Rock 3. Big Flower Rock 1

2:00 P.M. measured imprints of mule deer at feeder.

52 mm, 57 mm, 54 mm.

5:45 P.M. Leo Reef # 3, 0 seals, # 15 harbor seals, # 6, 8 harbor seal. All seals on top rocks at high tide.

Trip to Lopez Village. Junction Center and Cross Roads. 2 turkey vultures.

5:50 P.M. Orange-crowned warbler nest (see previous accounts) disturbed, young gone, overhead grasses separated but nest intact.

8:30 P.M. adult doe (mother) tracks measured 60 mm; young female 45 and 49 mm; young ♂ 52 and 55 mm.

8:35 13 Cowbirds (brown-headed) at porch feeder.

In last four days there have been from 2 to 12 glaucous-winged gulls and 2 to 7 double-crested cormorant on Leo Reef with harbor seals.

Since last notes on rufous hummingbirds I have observed these birds at feeder (sugar) and elsewhere.
