

4:30 P.M. 3 mule deer fed on leaves of madrone, <sup>a downed</sup>

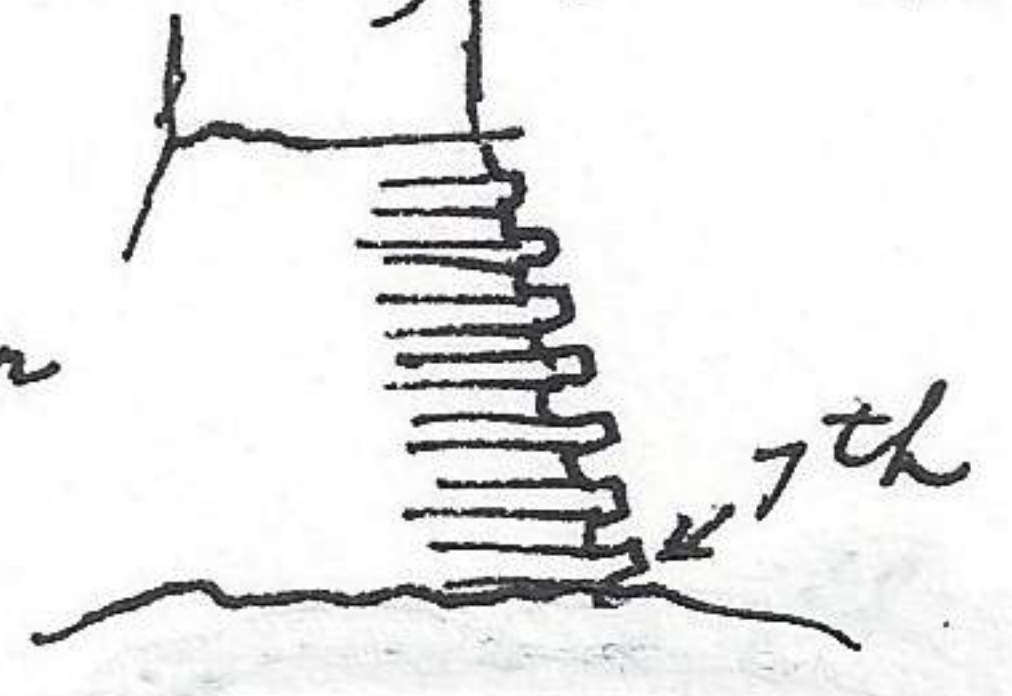
4:50 P.M. 110 glaucous-winged gulls in upper Flower Island and 52 on prominent rock at N end of island. Although I did not see the bald eagle all gulls left at 4:50 and circled to E then all back and settled at 5:00 P.M. Those on SW end left and returned. at 5:05 P.M. the gulls on the prominent rock left to W and alighted on water 1/10 mi beyond. They returned at 5:15 P.M.

The rock profile on N end Frost Island is ((Algae) Trentepohlia)

For the last 4 days there have been few pine siskins and more house finches. Currently at feeder are: 8 house finches, 2 purple finches, 6 brown-headed cowbirds, 2 dark-eyed juncos, 1 song sparrow, 1 american crow, 4 band-tailed pigeon, occasional pine siskin.

Between 5:05 P.M. and 5:35 P.M. gulls in parts of the Island (Flower) were displaced 5 times. They returned after circling the island once.

Eastern gray squirrels feed in several positions. The most common is sitting on haunches with body slightly bent forward, secondly head and body horizontal with head continuously on down or food and thirdly, especially when alerted, standing erect (body perpendicular). In cases of 1 and 3 above, food held in forepaws between thumbs.

5:15 P.M. Tide just below base of Leo Reef Beacon.

7:30 P.M. An adult bald eagle carrying a snake or trailing digestive tract of an animal flew W over John Sauls residence on Humphrey Head. Eagle first observed along shoreline of Blakely Island.

7:31 P.M. 48 black-headed cowbirds at feeder (Bee House) 3 of which were females.

One house finch has a yellowish-red plumage instead of the usual red color. It is frequently observed at feeder.

7:15 P.M. Townsend chipmunk left deer feeder on NW side of Bee House.

8:10 P.M. 43 black-headed cowbirds (4 of which were females) at porch feeder.

8:12 P.M. 1 adult mule deer and another group of adult female and 2 young 1/2 size adult, on W side Blakely Island (Bald Bluff)
