

9:00 - 10:00 A.M. Four mule deer (2 ad female, 3 young, & young) arrived from N along slope above shoreline and ate medrona leaves of limbs cut from tree (500 leaf clusters in last 3 days have been consumed by these deer); thence to deer feeder on NW side Bee House, thence N to Boundary Point and beyond.

9:40 A.M. 56 Harbor seal on Leo Reef.

28 glaucous-winged gulls on top Flower Island, 28 on rock prominence on N end of island. Also 3 double-crested cormorant.

9:50 A.M. 51 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island, 34 on rock prominence N end of island.

10:00 A.M. Boat displaced harbor seal on Leo Reef, some remained in water adjacent (40'50') reef, others left area to SW

10:07 A.M. First Harbor seal returned to Leo Reef.

10:09 A.M. now 7 Harbor seal on Leo Reef.

10:10 A.M. Another boat arrived at Leo Reef and displaced seal again. Boat followed seal that went to SW and these disappeared. Most of these boats have the objective of displacing the seal rather than observe them from a distance.

10:18 boat left for Flower Island.

10:23 first seal on Leo Reef.

10:25 small group 10 m water around Leo Reef, no rocks 9-10-11

10:28 14 harbor seal now on Leo Reef.

10:21 21 " " " " " " , larger seal return first.

11:00 42 harbor seal on Leo Reef.

12:15 P.M. 58 " " " "

2:30 P.M. 63 " " " "

4:20 P.M. 4 mule deer (family group on Bee Estate) watch O'Leary dog for 4 minutes then left at a run N across Bee Trail Slope to beyond.

5:20 P.M. 2 ^{mule} young deer of family group eating shrubs among cliff NW of house and as far out as they could reach.

9:00 P.M. Watch 4 mule deer ^{just} above shoreline at Bald Bluff Faultline, on W side Blakely Island. Also one adult bald eagle.

Have not observed deer on Frost Island.

I have not been able to ascertain where Harbor seal go after being forced off reef by high tide. During high tide I see individuals fishing alone shorelines but seldom over two together at one time.
