2:45 P.M. 26 harbor seal, 16 glaucous winged gulls, 1 black-oyster catcher, 1 double-crested cormorant on Leo Reef. The oystercatcher is rarely seen.

Daybreak 4:20 A.M. 7:30 A.M. raccoon at porch feeder. The raccoon generally come 3 or 4 times a week and always in evening.

7:45 A.M. 2 river otter to S. First chestnut-backed chickadee at porch feeder for about a week.

9:10 A.M. 26 glaucous-winged gulls (one pair copulating) on upper part of Flower Island and 15 on rocky prominence on north end of the island. Also 2 double-crested cormorant. On Leo Reef are 26 harbor seal and 13 glaucous-winged gulls.

1:00 P.M. Collected swallowtailed butterfly no. 860613-1 from junction of Sperry and Cape Mary rds on Lopez Island.

1:45 P.M. at 1 mi. N of Richardson noted a red-tailed hawk.
