

in aspen stand north of reservoir. They confined their feeding activity to lower bushes and undergrowth. A few were seen in road bordered by aspen near lake shore.

Black Headed Grosbeak. nest with one young about  $\frac{2}{5}$  grown. nest usual and fragile and six feet above ground in chokecherry among aspen. nest 20' from road <sup>and creek bed.</sup> The ♀ left at 25' on approach and flew 50' away to limb of aspen. did not call when near nest or approach when handling young one.

Rana pipiens. Several large ones by Pfautz cabin in marsh below reservoir.

Audubon warbler. Several were seen, one near lake. They confined their feeding to the upper limits of the aspen foliage in aspen stands.

Robin. Feeding among leaves in aspen trees.

Gray-headed Junco. Watched one group of 7 or 8 birds feeding in aspens at north end of lake. Several young birds in group. They chipped vigorously.

Spotted Sandpiper. Four or five on lake. Two favored one particular spot on lake shore. Two sandpipers fed with two Chipping Sparrows and 2 Juncos within 30' of shore line in open situation but near aspen edge.

Thrush (sp.?) Did not hear but saw several birds

Mule Deer. One standing in water at edge of lake. Lake west of Payson reservoir. Drove car on other side on road 200' away without deer leaving water. It appeared to be drinking  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch tadpoles in this lake but scarce in Payson reservoir.

Purple Martin. Flew by lake at 7:00 and was seen at lower lake west of reservoir. Appeared to be feeding in the air.

The upper end of the lower lake west of Payson reservoir appears to me to be an ideal trapping habitat for micrats and sores where the springs issue and are bordered by willow and rank flower growths. The dominant tree surrounding open field being <sup>the</sup> aspen. At this area found the Lincoln Sparrow, nest of spotted sandpiper with four eggs, Red naped sapsucker and House Wren. The phalarope nest was placed in short grasses near willow and creek but 150' from lake edge. Salamander, Pseudacris and a small bufo were found here. The Pseudacris were in damp areas but 100' from lake edge.
