8:00 A.M. Harbor seal in area:

31 north Flower Rock.

Left for Chris' home at Last Lake, Washington at 10:30 A.M. Day clear, cool, wind from S. young female mule deer in pp. Parking Lot on Bee Estate. Ocean spray on Humphrey Head at its best inflorescence which has been developing as full flowers in last 1 1/2 weeks. Two mule deer at Grace Church. Remained at Chris' June 21, 22, 23

June 24, 1986

Returned to Lopez Island. Red-tailed hawk at junction 522 and 405. 51 glaucous-winged gulls at Lopez ferry terminal. Highest tide at 12.7 today and Leo Reef rock no. 3 just visible. At Bee House caught: 860624-1 Sorex Total length 95 mm, tail 41 mm, skull only.

all seal on top of rocks (high tide) Boat wave dislodged 4 of them. Three other seal in water, 2 of them playing.

This A.M. fed 3 raccoon by hand, each 2 pieces bread.

9:20 A.M. all seal gone except 10 on Leo Rock no. 6. Seven swimming in water near reef. A boat "Kittitas" came near Leo Reef and displaced 5 of the 10 on Rock no 6 by wave action.

2:25 P.M. photo 860625-1 of shoreline at Dissected Point

2:25 P.M. low tide, 2:35 P.M. flow tide.

Photo 860625-2 of tidal surface below Bee House. Free floating algae shows rather rapid rate of growth with increase of temperature.
