

2:40 P.M. passed a mule deer bedded among conifers 30' n of Boundary Point. I walked 20' from deer and did not displace it. On the return trip  $\frac{1}{2}$  later it left <sup>at 40'</sup> as I passed by on trail. There are approx 11 bedding places on this shelf above the shoreline. The area is seldom disturbed.

Reifaus hummingbird at sugar feeder.

3:15 a boat (Viking Star) displaced 10 of 28 harbor seal on Leo Reef because of too close an approach.

Plant specimen 860625-4 specimen of grass from cliff meadow above (n) Spring Cove. Open field, damp soils from spring drainage.

860625-5 plant specimen Ocean spray (Holodiscus discolor) From ecotone between damp open meadow and Douglas fir forest. Average time for best flower growth. There is some fading of inflorescence but still brilliant.

5:00 P.M. Brown rat still active.
