9:00 P.M. Rufous hummingbird still active.
no mule deer observed today except one at Grace Church on Humphrey Head.

June 27, 1986

young ♂ and young ♀ mule deer at feeder this afternoon.

One raccoon on NE porch feeder at 9:05 P.M. and begged for food.

June 28, 1986

male (young) mule deer (antler approx. 1" high) grazed in yard as I stood 15' away. After eating some shrubs it left unafraid.

6 rufous hummingbirds at NE porch feeder. They consume 8 oz. of sugar solution per day.

Jack Saul said Lund feeds rufous hummingbirds (24 of them) at a rate of 18 oz. per hour.

1:15 31 glaucous winged gulls on ^{Flower} main island and 23 at rock prominence on N end of island. 26 of the gulls are on nests (either singles or pairs).

There are fewer gulls on Flower Island than on the 26th of June

Great numbers of madrone leaves now on ground (have been falling in last 2-3 weeks) and is considered unusual according to local informants.

5:20 A.M. Rufous hummingbird at feeder

5:30 A.M. ad. bald eagle left Leo Reef, flew directly to Bee House, then abruptly turn and flew N along shoreline at 60' height

5:45 A.M. adult bald eagle from direction of Leo Reef flew to Bee House, thence to Spring Cove and thence S along shoreline at approx. 40' high

areas of 6' x 10' of soaplike foam on water approx. 180' S Bee House and moving S. One 200' W Leo Reef and moving N. These spots maintain themselves and do not diffuse.

11:00 A.M. ad. bald eagle to Bee House from E thence S along shoreline at approx. 50' high.

An adult female and young (2nd year) at Bee House in evening.
