

The (bob-tailed) eastern gray squirrel at feeder for first time in 2 weeks.

"Christian", a large boat from Anacortes and the "Whim-brel" a sail boat both displaced harbor seal on Leo Reef.

12:20 P.M. young ♂ & ♀ mule deer groomed each other neck for 20'.

12:30 P.M. 31 seal on Leo Reef. The measurements of some are:

10, 18, 15, 17. Width 4, 5 1/2.

12:45 P.M. young rufous-sided towhee momentarily pecked at bill of song sparrow.

1:10 P.M. ♂ adult and ♂ & ♀ young mule deer fed at feeder, the adult for 8 minutes, the ♂ 1 1/2, ♀ young 2 min. When the left the adult went E the young went W. Later this family joined in Deer Trail meadow.

1:15 P.M. 38 harbor seal on Leo Reef, one measured 10 unets in ocular micrometer.

3:25 P.M. 37 harbor seal on Leo Reef, 2 glaucous-winged gulls and 1 double-crested cormorant.

6:00 P.M. ♀ mule deer fed 8 min. at feeder.

7:20 P.M. brown rats active.

Young of dark-eyed juncos, song sparrow, rufous-sided towhee and brown-headed cowbird fed independently.

8:40 P.M. 60 glaucous-winged gulls on upper slopes Flower Island, 28 at base, most NW part of island. Of these 13 nesting (nests) upper and 7 lower. At 10:00 A.M. one nest of glaucous-winged gull approx 1 foot from water. (Highest tide will occur at 10:25 A.M. at 7.9 feet).

Only one active brown rat at Bee House between 5:00-8:00 P.M., earlier observed 2 rats active between 9:00^{AM}-12:00 P.M.

8:50 P.M. water green from algae bloom below Bee House and in Spring Cove.

July 13, 1986

8:30 A.M. 8 harbor seal on Leo Reef. also 18 glaucous-winged gulls.
