

9:00 A.M. sailboat arrived at Leo Reef with nine divers, by 10:50 A.M. they were in water, all birds and seals displaced. They surfaced periodically and 11:00 A.M. lowered diving flag and by 11:20 left the reef on 2 hours and 15 minutes at reef. No harbor seals or birds on reef during that period of time.

Only one at at 6:30 P.M. today.

40 boats moored or anchored at Spencer Spit, at night is like a city with lights on.

July 20, 1986

7:30 A.M. bob-tailed eastern gray squirrel at feeder at Bee House.

8:30 A.M. 42 harbor seal on Leo Reef, 1 on Little Flower Island.

8:50 A.M. Intermediate reef of Leo Reef Rock no. 8 is now 2 inches above water. This rock is seldom seen.

9:15 A.M. ♀ mule deer at feeder. In contrast to local herd it spooked and ran to Deer Trail meadow. It left via upper left part of meadow. The local ♀ is confident and allow close approach to touching.
