Oct 1, 1986

Oct 4, 1992

8:00 A.M. On Leo Reef: 21 cormorants, 23 harbor seal, 8 glaucous-winged gulls.

1:20 P.M. a big skate, Raja binoculata approx 4' wide swam past Bee House to S. It was approx 6" below surface and continued S across mouth Spring Cove and on toward Lichen Point. It followed the shoreline out 6' except the bypass across the cove. Time at low tide.

1:30 P.M. Bonaparte gulls pass Bee House (both ways) every 2 minutes and were feeding on candlefish. 5 Arctic tern in same area.

Pair common murre in sound between Leo Reef & Bee House at least once a day.

One to 3 house finch, mainly ♂, at feeder during sometime during the day.

Winter wren once in every four days.

2 rufous-sided towhee regular feeder at feeder.

no brown rats since last one caught.

no mule deer except one male (♂) (single left eye tine) and then only at night.

Dark-eyed junco most common bird in area of Bee House and here all seasons.
