3 common murre on water SE Bee House. The head and neck is held low and forward . young fed from adults. arctic tern fly as if by surging thrusts.

861006-1 Hermit thrush, measurements only. Flew into window of Bee House. L. 178, wt 28 gms, wing spread 275 mm. Rusty tail ^(see below) and greenish gray back but chest & eye ring like Swainson's thrush.

Adult eastern gray squirrel ate continuously all day. young spent half time climbing trees and checking places seldom checked by adults. They jump ^{more} from high places from tree to tree than adults.

Eastern gray squirrel left feeder at 6:45 P.M., Townsend chipmunk at 7:05 P.M.

The hermit thrush above (861006-1) has lower $\frac{1}{3}$ of primaries and secondaries is light and shows a conspicuous band when wings are spread, disappearing when wings are closed. May be for confusing predators or used in courtship display.

9:20 A. Entire local deer at feeder. fawn, young ♀ and ♂ and adult. Cooper hawk left Cliff meadow on Bee Estate and flew S across Cove.

Recommendations for natural shorelines:

1. no permanent structures, boat ramps, stairs, tables, chairs, hammocks, barbeque stands, fire pits, buoys, storage of small boats, rafts etc.

2. no man made contrivances from driftwood or collection of driftwood.

3. Do not throw rocks into water as they cover marine communities.

4. Do not walk on vegetation or marine communities. use single path to vantage point.

5. Establish vantage point for view inside tree line or beyond shoreline.

6. no loud talk or music.

no crabbing or fishing

no dogs

no guns, flippers etc.

no sailing boards.

7. Educate to ^{passively} enjoy waterfront but do not used for recreational purposes.
