

left (10 mins after) cormorant began returning to reef and in 20 minutes 18 had arrived.

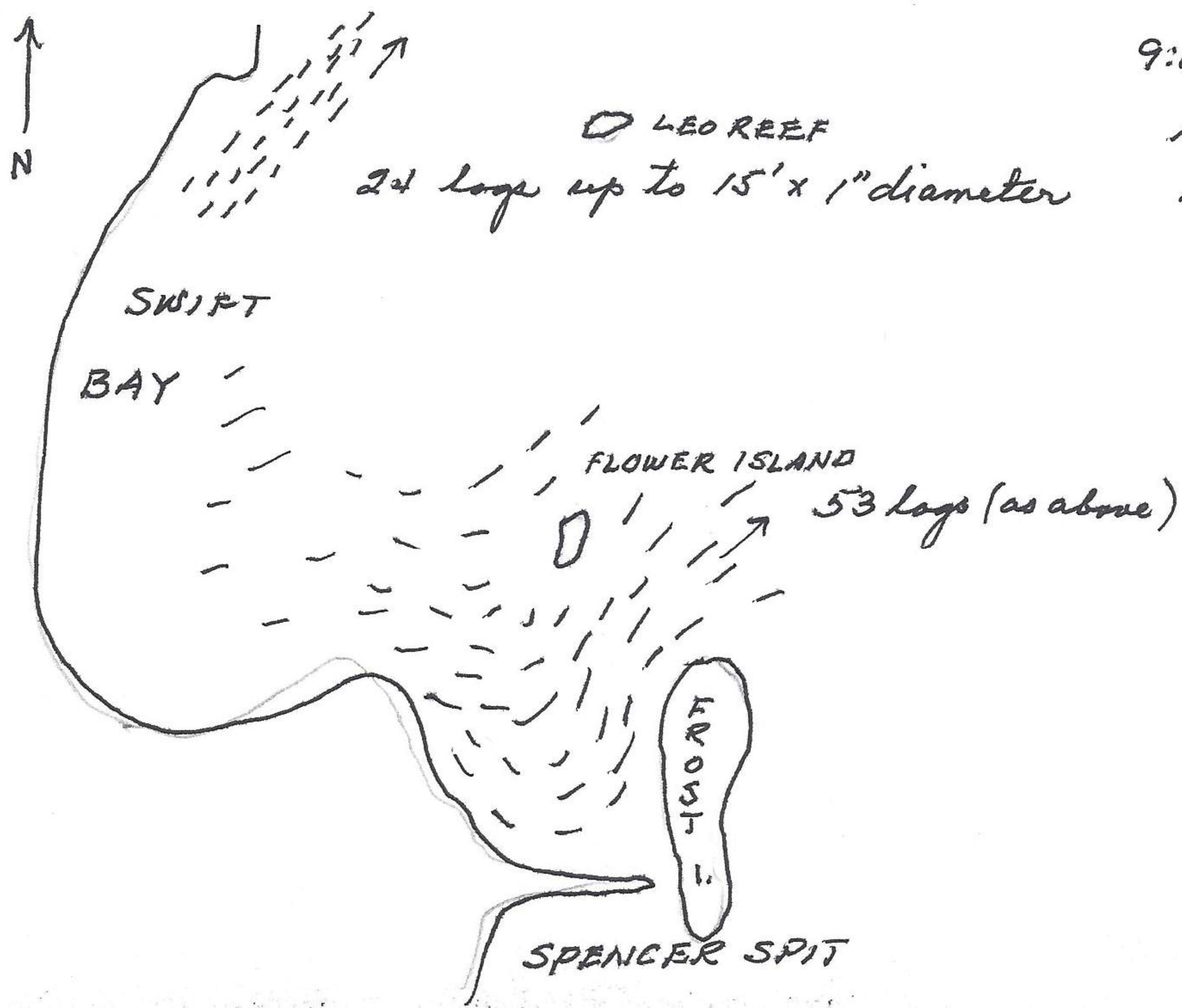
11:30 an adult bald eagle on Leo Reef. no cormorants but 10 harbor seal. Incoming cormorants (double-crested) circled but did not land. at 11:48 eagle left Leo Reef, flew directly to and over Bee House at approx 60' above house. 11:50 A.M. 3 double-crested cormorants on Leo Reef, 11:52 A.M. 14 cormorant on Leo Reef. 11:59 20 cormorant on Leo Reef all same species 12:11 P.M. 31 cormorant on Leo Reef, 12:25 41 cormorant on Leo Reef. 2:50 P.M. cormorants now occupying all available space on Leo Reef. (approaching high tide). Some cormorants standing next to harbor seal but not disturbing seal. Wave from ferry displaced 25 into water. They swam to W. As tide excluded. cormorant, more moved to platform of Leo Reef beach. 3 harbor seal came to reef but no space available & they left. Some cormorant arrived and tried to land, some above backs of seal, but could not or did not land. 4:00 P.M. 71 cormorant (double-crested) and 2 harbor seal Leo Reef.

4:05 P.M. a single Arctic loon on water in front Bee House.

Nov. 18, 1986

Strong wind and surf from S-SSE. High tide 7:24 A.M. and was 8.1 feet and highest we have had for some time.

at 7:06 A.M. approx 10 gulls flew slowly S along shoreline at about 80' high. 10 minutes later same number sailed straight N at 100' high and at extreme high velocity.
