

Dec. 27, 1986

at 21231 E Last Lake Road, Snohomish Co., Washington,  
collected 3 mammals:

861227-1 *Peromyscus maniculatus austerus* 168-90-21-17-12 gms. ♂,  
testis 4 mm.

861227-2 *Peromyscus maniculatus austerus* 202-100-21-17-22 gms ♀,  
uterus vascular.

861227-3 *Peromyscus maniculatus austerus* 185-94-22-17-17 gms ♂,  
testis 5 mm.

These 3 above specimens were from 50 museum special traps set  
10' apart in conifer-deciduous forest, second growth. 3 inches  
dried leaves on floor of forest.

Left Last Lake and travelled river road (Welch, Elliot and  
Lowell roads) to Everett, thence N Interstate 5 to Conway, thence  
W on highway (Fir Island Rd) to W. At 1 mi. W Conway first red-  
tailed hawk observed today. Within 2/10 miles distance observed  
3 red-tailed hawks at junction Whitney-La Conner Road and  
highway 20.

Dec 28, 1986

Prepared skull only of Sorex cinereus or vagrans presented to me  
by Mary P. Bee (her number 86210-1) collected at Kantishna,  
Denali National Park Preserve, Alaska. Mary collected it in Busia  
Cabin where she is in residence.

861228-1 Sorex 100-37-12-7-4.5 gms, ♀, ut. normal  
skull only. Collected and frozen Dec. 10, 1986.

Waves below Bee House 25 per minute.

Fawn fed at feeder this A.M. no other deer in area.

Eastern gray squirrel at feeder.

Pelagic Cormorant in rough and irregular wave action along  
shore below Bee House. in winds

Early this A.M. in dim lights, 2 bald eagles circled 200-400' above  
Bee House

Dec 29, 1986

7:30 A.M. Below Bee House waves 22 per minutes.

10:08 A.M. Single male goldeneye fed 15' from shore below Bee House.

Heavy winds all day. At 8:00 A.M. 64 glaucous-winged gulls  
visible either on or in water the full length of Blakely Island.  
from Peavine Pass to Thatcher Pass.
