Jan. 15, 1987

Day clear, shimmering water.

7:00 A.M. first bald eagle flew S past Bee House.

7:30 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull past Bee House.

8:00 A.M. no glaucous-winged or mew gulls in sight, numbers of gulls & bald eagles is associated with windy days. Ice on Swift Lagoon yesterday and today.

At 2:30 at Babcock Place a bald eagle flew N along shore. One perched in tree S of Babcock Place at edge of clearing from 1:30 P.M. to 3:00 P.M.

Jan. 16, 1987

Swift Lagoon in ice and no birds in area.

18 sandlings on Swift Bay Low Beach.

E end Swift Lagoon (1/10) in ice. 8 mallards, 4 shovellers in lagoon.

In last 7 days there has been an average of 8 sightings of bald eagles per day, mainly in A.M. From Bee House. at least 3 bald eagles together every morning.

32 American crows at feeder. Average is 13.

Since the snow of night of Jan 13, there have been an average of 18 (5-20) purple finch at feeder at one time

2:10 P.M. from Bee House can see 1 red-necked grebe, 1 red-throated loon 2 marbled murrelets, 2 single common murre (in summer plumage)

Jan 20, 1987

Ad. bald eagle alighted Leo Reef beam and displaced 46 double-crested cormorants. They remained as a group 250' S of beam.
