

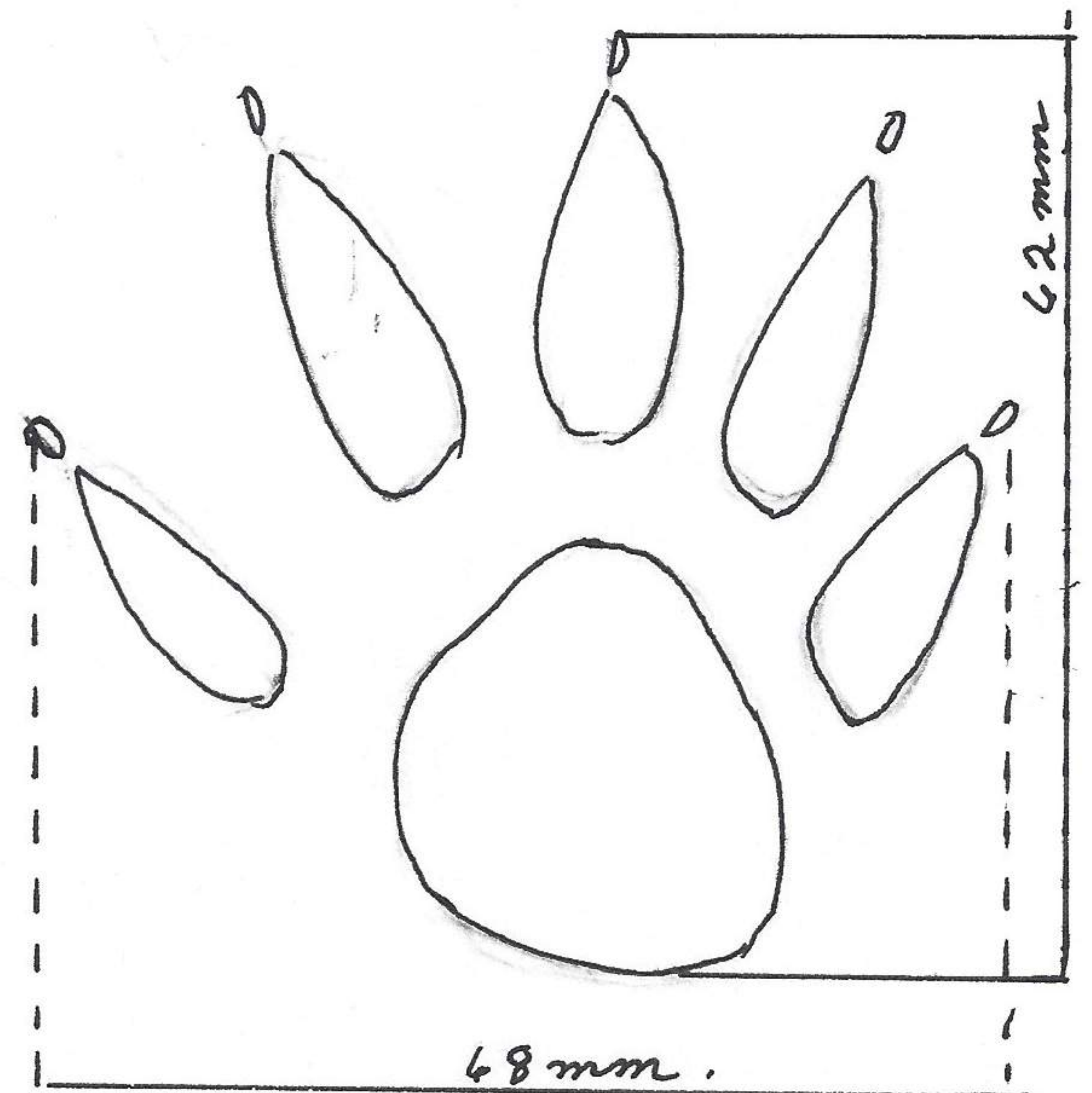
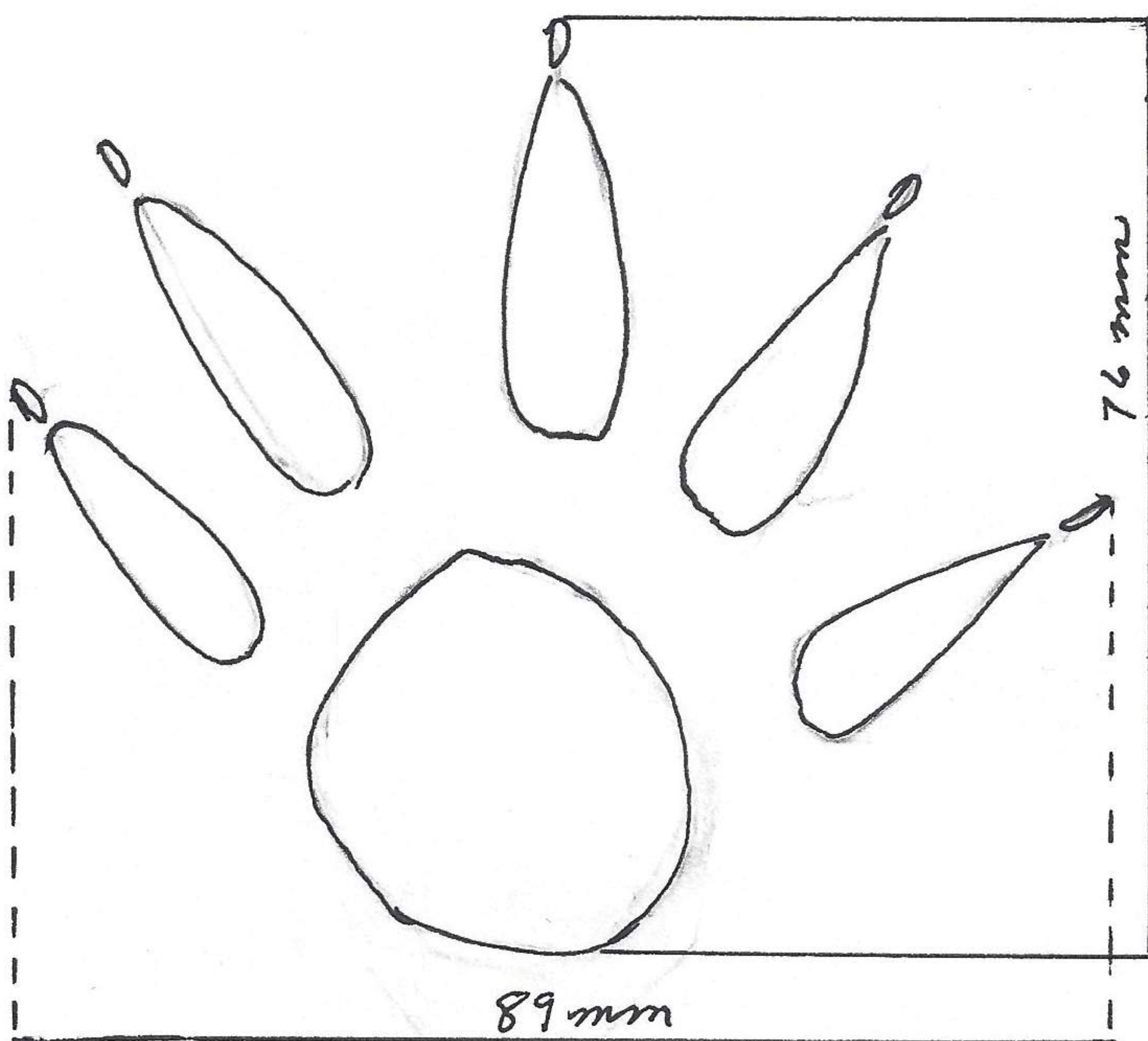

Photo 870121-1 of sunrise over Blakely Island from Bee House showing slapping clouds above the mountain,

7:20 A.M. 6 bald eagle sightings (2 pairs, 2 singles), 5 at 70' and 1 at 10' above water.

Photo 870121-2 of pre-sunup clouds, 5 minutes later than above showing more yellows & less reds.

7:45 A.M. another bald eagle 80' above water, also 2 red-necked grebes, 2 marbled murrelets together 150' SE from Bee House



The above imprints of tracks of river otter were copied from sands on beach with an overlay of transparent plastic and ink pen and then transferred to feed note paper as above. Other lengths were 77-72-66-55 mm.

Mary P. Bee started N on beach W side S Lopez Island (at Babcock Place) and I started E at S end Swift's Bay where Port Stanley Road turns W. We were to meet somewhere at Spencer Spit. Tide low and extensive beach exposed at late A.M. at a point just south of NE point observed a young river otter on a rock 6" above water eating some kind of animal. Two other river otter swam N 20' from rock and
