

observed a western grebe that was being eaten by a bald eagle.

at Bee House (2:30 P.M.) an immature glaucous-winged gull alighted on window sill of dining room window. It remained 5 seconds, then moved to N side window (3' from dining table and watched us for 20 seconds. A slice of bread was thrown on floor of porch and the gull immediately swallowed the entire slice with head and body movement that forced the gull back on its hind feet. A forceful thrust of head and neck pushed the bread farther into its mouth & throat. A second slice was fed to gull on rail of porch (2 feet away from our hand). A 3rd, 4th & 5th slice was also consumed. The gull remained 20 min. then left. This is the first gull to show confidence in man (up to 2 feet). While gull was feeding on bird feeder, it kept away the house and purple finch, ^{and} a young Eastern gray squirrel.

8:10 A.M. 6 bald eagles at Lichen Point at one time. One adult picked up 3" object from water. Day cloudy and sporadic
