Cooper hawk flew^{3'} over bird feeding tray at Chris.
Left Last Lake for Lopez Island.
First flocks^{in winter season} of mew gulls in fields S of Monroe
at approx 1 mi. NW on E Heath Rd from 522 overpass, 83 mallards in pond right of road. 1 red-tailed hawk in area.
at least 300 gulls sp? at Everett sewage plant ponds.
at 4 mi N on Interstate 5, approx. 600 Canada geese in field. 1/3 of them resting on ground.
4 mi. SE La Conner 1300 Canada geese.
3 mi. E Laconner, 1 adult bald eagle.
2 mi. SE Anacortes 1 ad. bald eagle.
at Anacortes ferry terminal, no gulls and only 3 bufflehead. Many crab traps in bay to SW (350 approx). Left on ferry 4:30 P.M. Censuses on N side route only 1 pelagic cormorant.

Feb. 14, 1987

At Bee House mule deer active all night.
First gull (glaucous-winged gull) at 6:58 A.M.
7:16 A.M. adult bald eagle flew from Blakely to top of conifer tree on Lichen Point on Lopez Island,
From 7:00 AM to at least 7:30 A.M. 1 to ^{flying} 15 mew gulls in air about 1 foot above water in a 10x50 binocular. They were all along N and W side of N Lopez Sound and randomly distributed.
7:28 A.M. an immature bald eagle alighted ^{saucy} top of a fir tree and
