

8 mew gulls, 2 red-necked grebes, 2 common loons, 4 marbled murrelets, 2 common goldeneyes, 4 hooded mergansers, 3 common mergansers,

Left Friday Harbor and returned to Lopez Island.

At Hummel Lake noted 4 American coot, 7 buffleheads, 2 common mergansers.

At Swift Lagoon: 1 killedeer, 6 gadwalls, 3 common goldeneyes

at Swift Bay Low Bank observed: 17 greater scaup, 3 surf scoters, 18 American crows, 12 glaucous-winged gulls.

March 10, 1987

Last night at dusk a family of mule deer came to feeder. The adult ♀ pelage was reddish in contrast to other 3. all deer constantly alert and stare either toward top of hill to N or toward O'Leary's property. They are not concerned at our presence behind kitchen window although ^{we are} only 4' away. This behavior of coming at dusk may be related to dogs. Last year the deer remained in the yard the greater part of the day. Their favorite resting place was just beyond Boundary Point but now they spend most of their time N of Joyce Fralico property or beyond.

6:47 P.M. mule deer family at feeder. High wind causes alertness.

March 11, 1987

1:30 P.M. pigeon guillemots fishing and riding waves approx. 150' SSE Bee House. Wave increasing last 1 1/2 hrs to 20 waves per minute. Glaucous-winged gulls generally leave Flower Island during high winds. Bald eagles displace gulls on Flower Island but the gulls return in 10-20 minutes.

2 mule deer, slightly larger than second year deer come to top of cliffs above feeder, started down half way 3 times then return to top. These are the first non-resident deer of this size noticed in a year of observation. They moved N into bench forest at Boundary Point. This group was a different group than the local group and were sharing the territory of the local group.

March 12, 1987

7:35 A.M. 1 river otter swam S out 30' from Bee House.

10:49 A.M. young ♂ of local family group, 28" high at shoulders,
