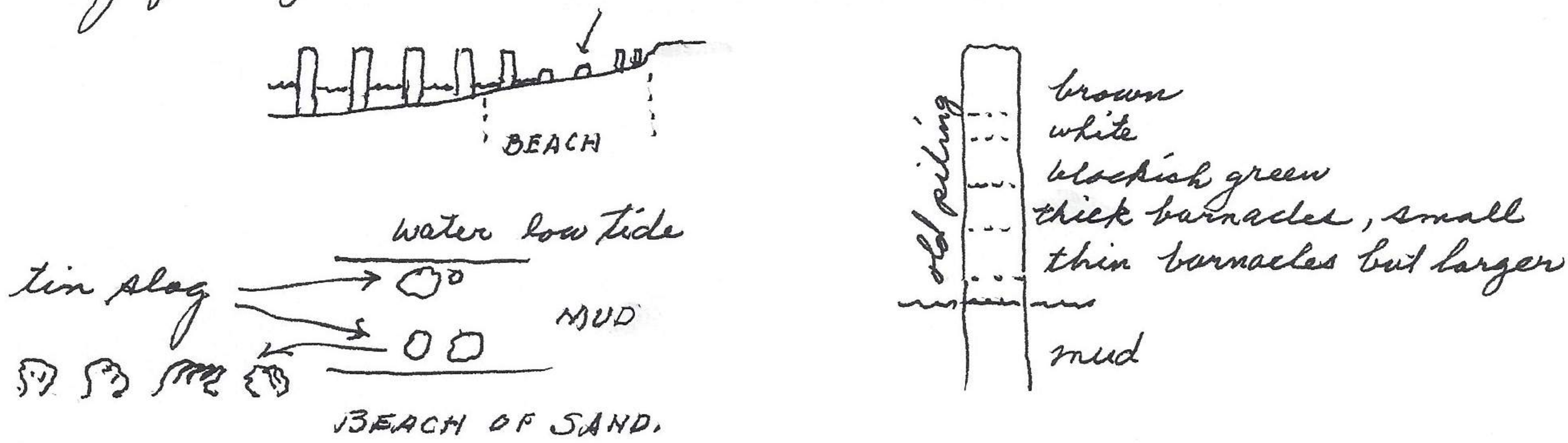
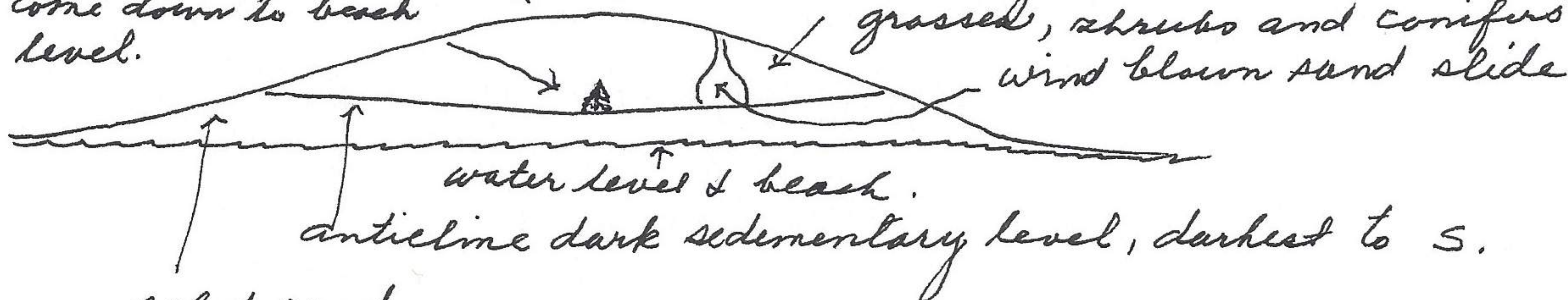


at Anacortes ferry terminal at head of bay to SW mapped piling of old
Canning factory: covered with rock weed.



In area three song sparrows, 1 Killdeer, 16 American crows, among
piling, 106 mew gulls on mud at edge of water and in one close
group, 12 glaucous-winged gulls generally distributed. In bay beyond,
3 ♀ and 1 ♂ greater scaup, 5 Common goldeneye, 3 great blue heron,
2 bufflehead. One glaucous-winged gull dropped a clam from 30'
four different times. Each time the clam was dropped the gull
alighted and picked up kelp surrounding the clam. On the fourth
try a mew gull approached the glaucous-wing gull for the clam but
the glaucous-winged gull displaced the approaching mew and con-
tinued with clam into the air.

The exposed sand slope at SW end Guernes Island thus;
conforms to here but to N they ^{beyond perspective} Face mostly sand but areas of solid
come down to beach level. grassed, shrubs and conifers

gulls (1, 1, 13) Panther Island covered with gulls, 1 per every 3-4 feet,
no gulls in channel, 3 pigeon guillemots, 1 double-crested cormorant.
W end Thatcher Pass 4:47, glaucous wing gulls 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, Willow
Island, pigeon guillemot, no harbor seal on Leo Reef, 1 marbled
murulet, bald eagle circling above eagle nest N end Humphrey Head,
2 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 pelagic cormorant, 1 pelagic cormorant.
