5:58, first bald eagle flew S past Bee House. as usual it fl. ps approx 60' above water and 40' out over water from Bee House.

6:01 AM 2 adult bald eagles and 2 immature bald eagles flew S past Bee House. destination ^{SW} Swift Bay shoreline.

7:04 A.M. Glaucous-winged gull fed on dead gull of same species ⁿ in Lopez Sound between Bee House and Leo Reef. An adult bald eagle swooped down and took the dead gull which was fragmented out of the water. An immature bald eagle challenged the adult in a 1/10 mi. pursuit.

7:05 A.M. 3 bald eagles fly ⁿ past Bee House, one on Leo Reef beacon.

April 5, 1987

Beginning daylight saving time (Advanced Clock 1 hr.).

7:00 A.M. A fishing group of 18 glaucous-winged gulls, 21 rhinoceros auklets, 5 pelagic cormorant, 2 marbled murrelets and 2 common loon participated as a unit. Gull formed compact group with other aquatic birds moving thru the gulls or near them. A harbor seal entered the group and all gulls left and circled 20' above. The alcids & cormorants dispersed but remained adjacent the 100'x100' fishing zone. Three minutes later the gulls left and the diving birds moved S, some 200' where they remained for 20 min. as a closed group of 23 rhinoceros and 3 pelagic cormorants. The loon and marbled murrelets left the area.

No mule deer at feeder since last recorded.

1:30 P.M. 18 harbor seal on Leo Reef 8 dark, 10 light.

O'Leary on S side Spring Cove on Humphrey Head, made seven trips in and out of Spring Cove during the day. Moors boat at head of cove.

April 6, 1987

6:45 A.M. family of mule deer at feeder at Bee House. young ♂ ^{of last year} 29" high at shoulder, fawn, 26" at shoulder. Left to n along beach-land.

6:48 A.M. 11 harbor seal on Leo Reef.

6:49 A.M. Usual number glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island. Same general group of gulls, cormorants and alcids SE Bee House. out 200'.

From Bee House collected:

870406-1 Peromyscus maniculatus hallisteri 190-81-22-20-32gms ♂ Testis 10mm diameter tail at 5mm below attachment to body and skinned 4.2mm.
