One bald eagle dropped to water with a captured gull then used the gull as buoyancy for taking off into air. 2 young domestic exotic rabbits at his place. Lund bought his property 25 years ago for 5,000, now worth 90,000.

8:25 P.M. to late dusk a 3" long bat fed in air in front Bee House.

Day cloudy, some blue sky.

To Friday Harbor via ferry: Left 9:55 A.M. Can see bald eagle on nest n end Humphrey Head. 10:05 Shaw Island, 5 glaucous-winged gull evenly spaced n side Shaw, 2 pigeon guillemots, 5 pelagic cormorants on Shaw Island piling. 7 western grebes in Shaw Bay. Gulls not nesting on piling at Shaw Island this date. Crossed channel to Orcas. Left Orcas 10:00 A.M. 8 glaucous-winged gulls following boat (do not include ^{incensus gulls} that follow boat), 1 pigeon guillemot, 2 glaucous-winged gulls on shore. On n side of Shaw as we pass E up Harney Channel, 20% madrona in full blossom, yellowish white, along n side 3 separate pigeon guillemots, 4 red-necked grebes together, 1 single red-necked grebe and 1 immature bald eagle in tree near shore 1/2 way n shore Shaw Island. Birds in Upright Channel (and as always 200' out from ferry on one side), pelagic cormorant, 2 glaucous-winged gulls. Flat Point 10:42 AM, 2 pelagic cormorant, no birds in San Juan Channel. Friday Harbor. a *Thamnophis* (blue stripes) in side street n town. Left Friday Harbor, 1 common murre, 6 pigeon guillemot. Shaw Island ferry terminal, 1 common loon, 2 pigeon guillemot remained side of ferry 150' as we entered Shaw Island terminal. Left Shaw Island, 1 common loon, 1 surf scoter, 1 common loon, 6 separate glaucous-winged gulls. To Orcas, thence Lopez Island. At Swift Lagoon: 1 great blue heron, 2 mallards, 2 gadwalls, 2 green-winged teal, 1 cinnamon teal, 1 bufflehead, 4 northern pintails, 1 killdeer, 1 greater yellowlegs. At Swift Bay Low Bench: 42 mew gulls, 11 surf scoters, 8 glaucous-winged gulls, 13 American crows, and other birds.
