

Eastern gray squirrel present at Bee feeder 40% of day.

no male deer today up to 6:50 P.M.

7:00 P.M. 1 river otter swam south past Bee House and then beyond Lichen Point.

7:01 P.M. Immature bald eagle flew past Bee House. In flight body action a lester-totterlike jerk.

7:10 P.M. Family mule deer at ^{Bee House} feeder plus related group of ad. female and young. The feeder measures $13 \times 11 \times 5$ " deep and at times 6 heads within feeder. The new arrival ♀ and young are not compatible with local family. The newcomer struck the fawn and young ♀ twice. The fawn did strike back. There was no nose contact as frequently happens between unrelated deer. Actually this new comer is related to local group as well as a ♂ that come occasionally. The local group when it becomes too large divides and some of the larger or older individual establish territory near by but at the same time shares the original territory from which it came. Ads. have more colorful brown pelage than young. Young of last year are similar but less bright color. ^{Last year's} Fawns have dark stripes down neck and back.

2:00 P.M. Turkey vulture circled over Bee House then dropped down to 10' of water then up again to circle above Lichen Point.

To Lopez Island Village. Red-tailed hawk on top house E side Humphrey Head Lagoon. One turkey vulture circled above Plummer home on Humphrey Head and one over Spencer Spit.

6:00 P.M. A river otter swam past out 20' from Bee House. Sometimes held head at eye level while swimming.

6:20 P.M. A young bald eagle left Douglas Fir tree on Boundary Point, flew E and circled above Bald Bluffs. This bird perched on tree above Lichen Point that is not the usual site for eagles.

Common loon in summer pelage. Abrupt forehead good field mark.

at -1.8 tide at 1:17 P.M. at Bee House, the second of 2 rocks between Round & Flat points just exposed.
