

2 in front and 1 in rear of eagle. Only one gull was observed to molest a flying eagle and this was an attack from the rear and rear contact of the back of the eagle. This occurred when eagles were arriving at the island this A.M. During resting time the gulls and crows vigorously dive and attack the eagles when they approach or land on the island.

8:04 A.M. Immature bald eagle alighted on dead Douglas fir tree (Fratie Perching Tree) on benchland just N of Boundary Point.

8:23 A.M. The 6th eagle (last remaining) left Flower Island and flew E.

11:10 For the last 1 1/2 hrs. only 25 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island. This is low tide and a time when many gulls are feeding on rocky shorelines & beaches elsewhere.

11:12 13 western grebes in one group between Bee House and Leo Reef. They came as close as 200' of House but generally are nearer Leo Reef. Last 2 days have seen group of 6 in same area. The western grebes as a group passed thru two red-necked grebes that were feeding. The red-necked grebes did not follow the western grebes.

12:00 A.M. 12 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island.

This P.M. (3:00 P.M.) to Agate Beach. met Mr. Truxton B (Bunk) Tropell, most northern house on E side road at Agate Beach, Lopez Island, whose mother was a Bee from Norway originally. as was his father Mr. Tropell. From 3:00 to 5:00 P.M. a bald eagle (white beginning in head) rested on a large rock in Outer Bay.
