

alternately feeding (average 10 seconds) and perching on limb 2 feet away (20 sec to 1 minute) ^{it} jerked ^{its} head up and down with bill at 50° - 60° . The motion was vigorous and performed ^{continuously at} approx. 10 times in 8 seconds. As lights were fading to degree where bird was barely visible, it left while still moving head up & down and flew S.

- 5:28 A.M. first rufous hummingbird at feeder.

 5:30 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull flew N.
 5:35 A.M. third rufous hummingbird at feeder
 5:36 A.M. In a period of 1 minute 3 more rufous hummingbirds arrived at feeder.
 5:39 A.M. Immature bald eagle flew S at 50' high.
 5:41 A.M. Jonathan (same glaucous-winged gull) arrived at house.
 5:51 A.M. Imm. bald eagle flew SW from across Lopez Sound from Blahely Island to Lichen Point, circled and then flew S toward Surf Bay shoreline. Height approx. 100'.
 5:57 Imm. bald eagle flew E past house at 60' high. Jonathan (same gull) left top of house and flew down under eagle at water level. The eagle held bill down and moves head from side to side in surveying the water or land below.
 8:00 A.M. Both rufous hummingbirds and band-tailed pigeons fed on or from the inflorescence of madrona trees.
 8:45 A.M. young ♂ & ♀ fed at feeder. ♂ 29 1/4" high. Both seemed nervous at feeder, not at me as I fed the ♂ apples. Their concern came from hillside above the cliff. The ♀ ran up trail, followed by ♂ where they showed alertness in the direction of W. They gained ridge S of Fratic House and then ♂ ran down slope to E with tail held like a white-tailed deer. The ♀ followed & tail held down. My only guess is they were reacting to dogs ^{to the W} that I could neither see or hear.
 1:30 P.M. stray ♀, 29" high
 1:31 P.M. 3 northern violet-green swallows inspecting front of house under roof eaves.
 6:00 P.M. Immature bald eagle rested on perching tree E of John Saul Jr residence on Humphrey Head. It remain there to at least 8:10 P.M.
