

8/28/38 Mr. Halfinden of Lehi sent me a (872JB)
Myotis cinerea cinerea. While fishing with a fly on the
 Provo River at Steldwood he caught this bat by the wing
 in making his cast. Length 139 m.m.
 Tail 61 m.m. ♀
 Foot 11.5 m.m.
 Wing sp. 416 m.m.

9/4/38 Visited Mr. Miner of Springville. Mrs. Miner has
 about 20 minks of the eastern species. Their habits are
 much like the weasel. Two escaped the pens and were
 about 1/2 hour in getting them back again. To see them
 sneaking through the weeds with their heads held high
 gave them the appearance of the weasel. They are very
 nervous and when being fed jump from nest box to
 floor in a rhythmic manner. Mr. Miner is to receive
 10 *Chinchilla* from Price Utah. He owns one and is to
 keep the others for a gentleman in Price.

9/6/38 Sight record of *Citellus grammurus utahensis* at
 Bridal veil falls at about 12 o'clock noon. Also a
 sight record at Springdell in Provo Canyon; one at
 the new Deer Creek Dam now under construction in
 Provo Canyon; one 2 block up Provo Canyon from
 Vavarian Park.

9/3/38 Sight record of two *Citellus grammurus utahensis*.
 One at the Provo City junk pile and another 2 blocks
 up Slate Canyon. Both observations about noon. On
 this trip collected two sample of concretions from the
 tellite formation near first water mine. While chisel-
 ing this fossils out of formation on hillside watch a
 Great Horned Owl fly up canyon near spring. Following
 directly behind in close pursuit were 7 magpies. When
 the owl lit in oak tree the magpies closed in around
 it. The peculiar thing about the incident is the fact
 that the magpies did not physically attack the owl
 but quietly followed it around. In returning home
 visited the mill race below Air Port. Near Bullocks fur
 farm found a Spotted Sandpiper on bank of lateral stream
 that had been effected by beehive. In a very awkward
 manner it found its way to water and when on surface
 swam freely about. It still retained the characteristic
 teetering. Other well ^{sp.} sandpipers were observed by able
 to fly. Six mallard & a few pintail were found dead on
 banks of stream. About 80 mudhens were seen in more or
