

no boats in N Lopez Sound after 7:45 P.M. The greatest number of boats in N Lopez Sound from point E of Bee House to Thatcher Pass was 36. At beginning of census at 1:43 there were 26 boats in sound (17 motor, 9 sail).

7:45 P.M. 104 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island. 4 pairs were observed copulating in a 15 minute period. Birds in back standing position averaged 40' each. 10 gulls were on nests.

6:35 P.M. 2 imm. and 1 adult bald eagles flying low 300' E of N end Humphrey Head.

This evening and since recording of rufous hummingbirds there have been on an average of 5 birds at the feeder, most frequently 3 ♂'s and 2 ♀'s.

Two bald eagle sightings today.

May 27, 1987

7:00 A.M. northern violet-green swallows active at nest.

12:10 P.M. 4 river otter swimming N 3-4 feet from shore.

12:30 P.M. 3 ♂, 3 ♀ rufous hummingbirds at feeder.

1:20 P.M. an adult size ^{male} deer ♂ had antlers 1 1/2" less than length of ear. It fed in area for 1/2 hr, along with young ♂ of local family group. It finally moved N along bench beyond Boundary Point. All deer are frequently eating new growth on Douglas fir.

1:40 P.M. a band-tailed pigeon flew from Humphrey Head, above Bee House in a straight SE direction. It arrived at Blakely Island at about 300' high at a point above Willow Island and instead of landing on Blakely Island it flew up over a fog bank that covered the upper 1/3 of the mountain; its destination at least Slocum Island & maybe beyond.

2:50 P.M. 11 band-tailed pigeons landed on porch rail feeder (9' long) and initially each bird created a 3"-5" interval by pecking at its bordering neighbors. As they started to feed the interval was ignored and the birds moved about side-by-side.

Flower Island is more yellowish-brown (open areas) now than earlier in the month when the color was greenish yellow. Trees and bushes are normal summer green.
