

4:15 PM Friends of O'Leary (renters? 2 males, 2 females) approached Leo Reef in boat. 5 harbor seal left island and as boat circled reef at about 30', the seal displayed at E end by splashing, especially with Tail (double (2) cartwheels and general commotion at about 30'. When boat circled second time the seal performed at SW end of reef at 15' from reef. I had never observed seal display in such close quarters. They (the seals left but occasionally a head or two protruded at 200' 300' away. The party of 4 landed on island at 4:25 P.M., tramped the entire reef climbed beach, one to light level while the boat circled the island 5 times. They left at 4:35 P.M. and returned to O'Leary's. O'Leary must be informed of regulations and renter behavior. 9 other people (13 in all) at O'Leary's this afternoon.

7:05 P.M. young ♂ male deer of local family group at feeder. noticeable change in pelage and contrast to other 2 young of family group. He had a narrow reddish stripe from head to tail on dorsum. This same color extended forward from tail to knee . The area immediately above the eye is a colorful tan. The young ♀ and fawn (second season) of family group were repeated by the male. Antlers slightly longer. The two ♀'s remained 15' from feeder.

Left for Chris' home (Lost Lake) as we passed N end Humphrey Head noted flat topped bald eagle nest but no birds on nest or in area. Slopes of Blakely and Lopez islands have dried brown grasses.

At Painter Island glaucous-winged gulls average 5 feet space
