

interval and all above black zone above high tide.

SE of Anacortes where railroad crosses bay (to S) the low tide has exposed an expanse of mud that is only slightly tinged with green whereas a month or so previously the exposed flats were a bright yellowish green.

Continued on to Seatac air port S of Seattle to pick up Jim & Liz Malseed. Returned to Chris & Steven on Lost Lake and remained there overnight.

June 3, 1987

Left for Lopez. Left Anacortes Ferry Terminal 12:00 P.M. while passing Leo Reef counted 11 harbor seal on SE side reef. no seal on NW side. Arrived Lopez Island.

4:35 P.M. River otter swam N past Bee House. did not fish along way.

Rufous hummingbirds returned to sugar feeder 1 1/2 minutes after new supply of food placed in feed.

Fawn at deer feeder on our arrival.

June 4, 1987

9:15 A.M. Bald eagle flew E to Blakely Island.

9:20 A.M. Last year fawn (up until now have recorded this mule deer as "the fawn" of the local family group), fed at feeder and after finishing scratched soil in trail 3' from feeder and reclined. Stayed there for 45 minutes. The local family is seldom associated with their mother when feeding and may be result of female preparing for parturition.

7:30 P.M. At least 3 large (3' ^{or more}) salmon? fed in front of Bee House from 3 feet from shore to 30' from shore and in a 100' linear area along shore. They fed on surface and created considerable water agitation as they approached the surface and then turned over and submerged again. The candle fish would break water for a second or 2 and then the fish would pass thru the same area a capture the fish. At first I thought they were seal because of size and amount of agitation of water but a closer look at shoreline proved they were fish and most likely large salmon (dark greenish backs). A 5" herring line bait was set in general area but although fish surfaced 3 times not over 6' away, they never touched the bait.

9:50 P.M. adult & young raccoon at porch feeder. Last night
