On old logging trail W of saw ad. female mule deer of local family group of Bee Estate. The fawn and young ♀ were at The Bee House at the same time so the family is separated by at least $3/10$ mi. At 1:30 P.M. this female was observed at feeder at Bee House.

4:00 P.M. 21 harbor seal on Les Reef and 1 on North Flower Rock. 2 Glaucous-winged gulls were observed breeding on Flower Island. Pair also breeding at Lopez Island ferry terminal this afternoon. They seem to breed at times on remote places far from nesting islands.

June 6, 1986

8:10 A.M. ^{river} 3 ^{rather} feeding in front of Bee House in same area as salmon were feeding on candlefish.

8:30 A.M. single marbled murrelet feeding 150' SE of Bee House.

The family group of mule deer are feeding independently and not associated with ad. female during the period of pending or actual parturition of the ad. female.

8:45 A.M. young ♀ pelage just starting (reddish) on upper rump above tail.

This A.M. 10:00 To Friday Harbor. 2 pigeon guillemots at Shaw ferry terminal. approx. 250 gulls (glaucous-winged) in raft E of Conoe Island. Returned Lopez 2:00 P.M.

4:15 P.M. Last year fawn at feeder. Takes apples at window but only within 2 feet outside and to this extent differs from young female + young male.

At Shaw one glaucous-winged gull on nest of superstructure over exit of ferry traffic and one on a nest on top of a bundle of piling on S side of slip. Nests on these pilings have been
