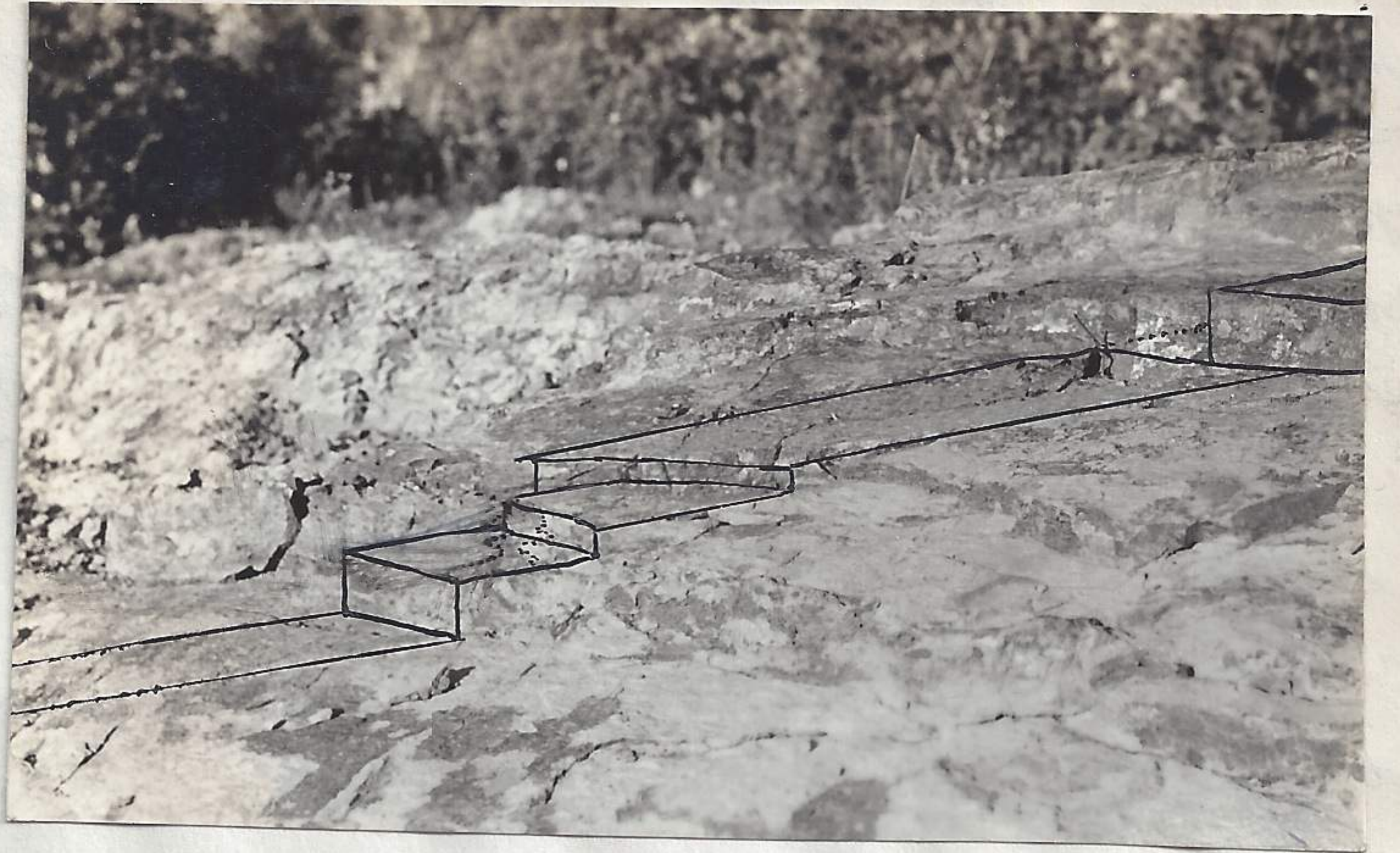


General shot showing the faulting systems of the rocks. Fracture mainly in a north, south trend.

On return trip observed a deer and collected a *Phrynosoma douglassi ornatum* near *Lepidodendron* outcropping. In trail found the tail feathers of a Spurred Towhee and associated with this find was a Goshawk about 100 feet away. It may have been possible that this hawk had attacked the Towhee only a few minutes ago. Two Towhees were seen here near scene of tail feathers. The donkey-ear plants were dead and one could not help but make considerable noise when walking through them. There has certainly been a remarkable change in the plant growth
