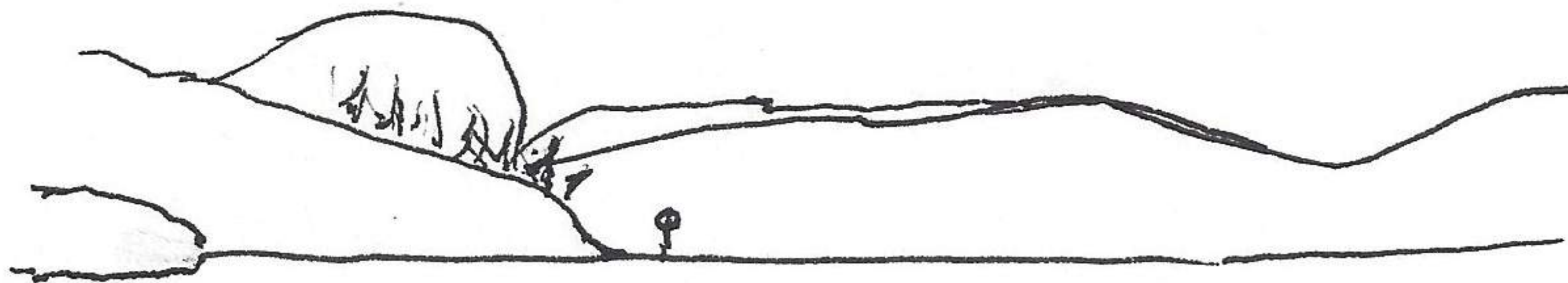

11:07 AM tide level. (low)

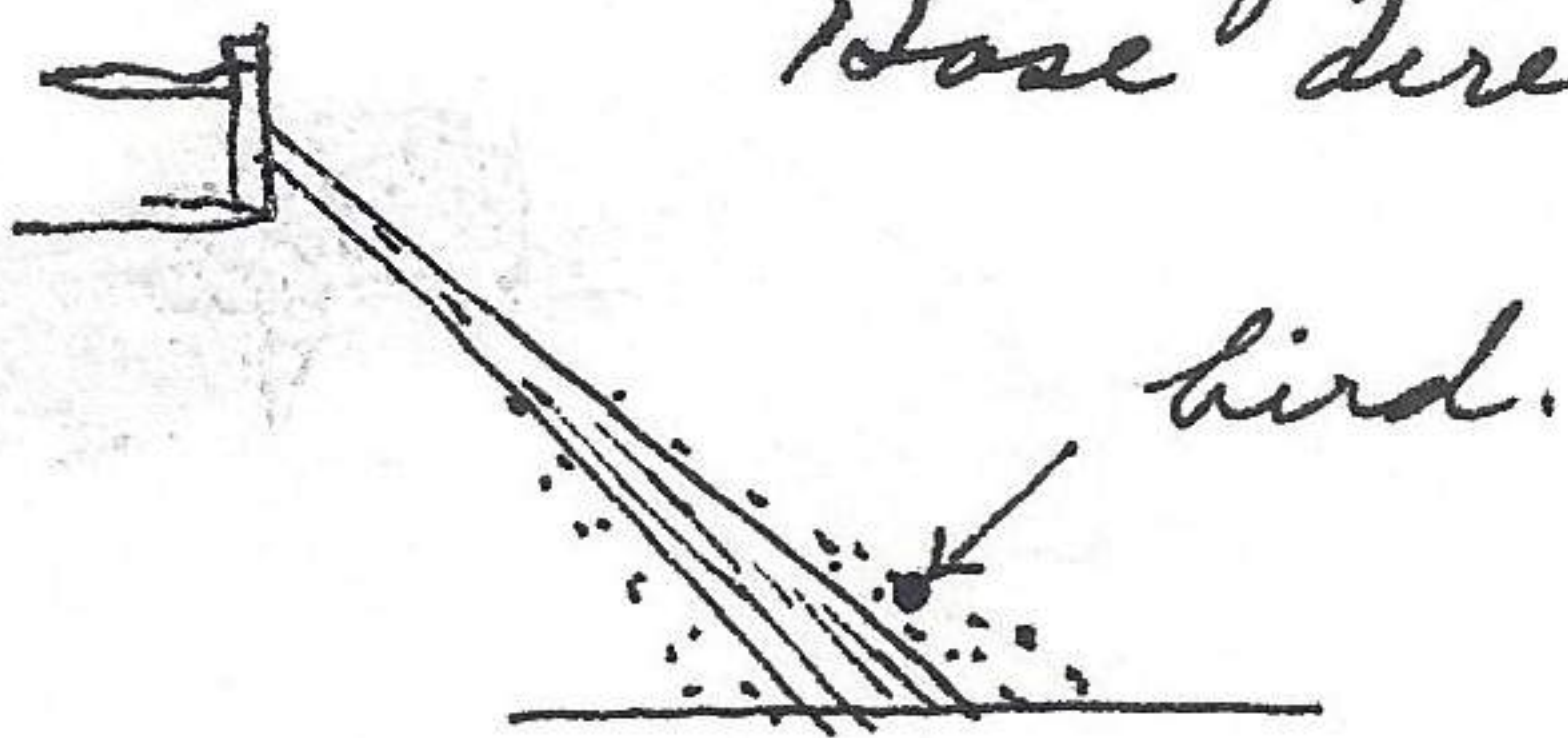

 times it followed up the stream 12' to near point of issue

 Mammal Deer, a mule deer (black-tailed deer sub sp.) Odocoileus columbianus was observed swimming SSW approx.
 300' E of Bee House. It moved approx. 1 mile per hour and
 created a wake. It stopped, turned around, remained station-
 ary 3 minutes then returned on same route and continued on
 to N end crescent of cliffs at a point where deer probably
 fell from cliffs to rocky shore. As it was headed toward land at
 25' away a large dog (owned by Harold Klein of Humphrey
 Head) swam toward the deer now 30' from shore. The
 dog travelled twice the speed of the deer. The deer swam
 S but was attacked by the dog for 1 minute as the deer
 move away from shore some 80' leaving the dog behind
 which returned to shore and climbed to top of cliffs. In four
 minutes the deer returned to 25' from shore when the dog,
